7 Nabbed on Charge of Attempted Bribery

WASHINGTON, Jan. 23. — (AP) — The FBI announced today the arrest of seven men in New York City and Columbia, S. C., on charges of conspiring to bribe a war assets administration official.

FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover said the men tried to bribe the WAA official at Columbia to give them preferential attention in the purchase of nearly \$1,000,000 of steel and women's and men's clothing.

The FBI director said special agents arrested the following at Columbia last Tuesday:

Edward Siegel, 44, a New York attorney; George A. Stein, 47, of Philadelphia; Rudolph Shifler, 32, Philadelphia; and Charles Kessler, 50, Philadelphia.

Last night, Hoover said, FBI agents arrested in New York City, George J. Aaronson, a merchandise buyer, and his two sons, Myron and Jules Aaronson.

anced if the legislature adopts Governor Snell's proposal to use corporation income tax surpluses, if this proposal is not attacked in court, and if liquor profits will be as high as Budget Director George Aiken estimated them.

Car Racket to be Probed
Moves to curb unscrupulous used car dealers who pad their sales contracts to force buyers to pay absurdly high finance charges held the legislative spotlight here today.

The House Committee on Financial Institutions launched the used car dealer investigation after A. A. Rogers, state banking superintendent, said he received one complaint each week from car buyers cheated by car dealers, Rogers asserting that the padded finance charges run as high as 70 per cent.

Sen. Frank H. Hilton, Portland, said he is introducing a bill to order the Board of Control to acquire 1,000 acres for a new state prison, with the cost to be less than \$250,000. He said the prison, now located in Salem, would be located 10 or 12 miles from the city. Building a new prison is recommended by the Interim Committee on prisons and jails, of which Hilton is chairman.

Tax Job Begins Next Week
The House Assessment and Taxation Committee, faced with a score of proposals for new taxes, will begin its work next week. Sales tax proposals are expected to get first consideration.

Bills to extend the \$3,000 state income tax exemption for veterans to a date a year after their discharge and to place county veterans' service officers under direction of the State Department of Veterans Affairs were introduced in the House, while the AFL program to increase workmen's compensation benefits 50 per cent also went into the House.

A proposal to segregate senile persons from mentally diseased persons at the state hospital won approval of the House Social Welfare Committee.

Sen. Douglas McKay, Salem, introduced a bill to prohibit children under 16 years old from being employed in hazardous occupations.

The Joint Ways and Means Sub-

committee on higher education said today it has been advised that the State Board of Higher Education is satisfied with its \$21,355,946 budget for the next two years.

The amount is \$4,400,000 less than the board originally requested, the budget having been pruned by Budget Director George Aiken.

Most of the reduction was accomplished by eliminating \$3,500,000 for capital outlay for the next biennium.

Agencies Merger Asked
The bill to consolidate the State Game and Fish Commissions and the State Forestry Department into a single State Department of Conservation was introduced by State Rep. Joe Wilson, Newport.

The Oregon Nursery Association said it is introducing a bill to raise at least \$5,000 a year for research on disease and plant improvement at Oregon State College.

The money would be raised by a tax on licensed nurserymen and florists.

Eagles Offer New Use
For State Indian School
PORTLAND, Jan. 23. — (AP) — Declining need for the Chemawa Indian school will prompt efforts to have it transferred to the state for use as an intermediate institution for juvenile first offenders, a fraternal organization president said today.

James W. Bryan, Jr., Bremerton, Wash., national president of the Fraternal Order of Eagles, said he had discussed the matter with Oregon legislators who would propose memorializing congress for the transfer.

Bryan said the plan came up as part of the organization's program for youth throughout the country.

Woman 'Drunk' Jailed
Patricia M. Miller, young woman who was arrested by city police last night at the Mosher St. railroad crossing, was sentenced to 10 days in the county jail for drunkenness on a public street. Justice of the Peace Hartfel reported.
