In the plan now approved, the city and county radio are to operate on a different frequency from the state police. A receiving set tuned to the state police frequency will be at the city's police station. All necessary calls are to be rebroadcast to city and county cars.

At a reasonable cost, the receiving sets now in use in the city are to be changed from the state police frequency to that which the Federal Communications Commission would grant the city, Lund said.

School Fund Dole Facing Hot Fight, Senator Says

SALEM, Ore., Jan. 29. — (AP) — House Bill 9, the measure to distribute to school districts the \$16,000,000 basic state school support fund, will result in a tremendous fight and probably won't be passed in its present form, State Sen. Paul Patterson, Hillsboro, chairman of the Senate Education Committee, said last night in addressing the Salem Business and Professional Women's Club.

He said no clear-cut issue has yet been made on the equalization feature of the plan, and said serious thought must be given to this phase.

"Stop and think—equalization of what? Is it to be equalization of costs, or equalization of educational opportunities?" he asked.

He reminded the group that many school districts will face the problem of raising special tax levies, regardless of what funds they may get under the school support law, and he warned against thinking the law is the answer to all school difficulties.

France, reported a reading of seven below zero (Fahrenheit). Hundreds of Parisians, too poor to buy their low-priced fuel ration, crowded into subway stations to sleep on benches until herded out at 1:30 A. M., closing time.

With coal deliveries halted by frozen canals, Paris officials announced new restrictions on gas consumption would become effective Feb. 1.

In the 769-square-mile area of London there were heavy cuts in supplies of gas and electricity, the only source of heat for many thousands of homes.

Moderating temperatures in Italy brought cloudy, wet weather and an epidemic of colds. Milan, with a low of 18, was the coldest spot in the country. Mercury readings south of the Genoa-Milan-Venice line all pushed above the freezing mark.

Moscow, with a sunny 56 degrees (Fahrenheit), was one of the continent's warmest cities.

Similar bills have died in the past three legislatures, but the same bill is in effect in 25 other states and is endorsed by the Fed.

U. S. Ends Peace Effort In China; Marines to Leave

at Tsingtao aiding a navy training program.

SHANGHAI, Jan. 29. — (AP) — Chinese student groups which have been demanding American withdrawal greeted gleefully the news of the U. S. abandoning mediation efforts, but political and business circles, fearful of a protracted civil war, expressed no great elation.

Business elements which have

clung to hope against hope for settlement of the civil war and the beginning of a sound economic recovery were not happy to see the U. S. abandon its efforts at mediation, fruitless as they have been.

Many expressed fear that the war surely would accelerate.

The British-owned North China Daily News called the move a "natural corollary to Marshall's memorandum to Truman and Marshall's ascendance to the post of secretary of state."

China, the newspaper said, must now work out her own salvation.

In no quarter was the news viewed as a concession to Russia, for was any immediate change expected in Soviet policy in north China and Manchuria as a result.

Iserman said Ball's bill to revise the Wagner Act "reflects a remarkable understanding of the problems of management and labor under the present act."

Among other things, the measure would give employers the right to fire strikers; make unions liable for unfair labor practices; authorize industry to petition for injunctions against "unlawful strikes"; and give greater recognition to independent unions.

Freeway Bill Faces Fight
The freeway bill, bearing the blessing of the State Highway Commission, good roads enthusiasts and chambers of commerce, will have the bitter opposition of roadside business men.

The bill would let the highway commission establish through highways specially designed for through traffic, and the owners of abutting land would have either limited access or no access at all.

Ninety seconds are required to go a mile at 40 miles an hour; at 100 miles an hour the time is 36 seconds.
