

Ruling May End Liquor Serving by Fraternal Clubs

SALEM, Ore., Feb. 6.—(AP)—A ruling by Wilbur Henderson, attorney for the State Liquor Control Commission, will mean that most fraternal clubs and many other licensees will lose their licenses to serve liquor, Rep. O. H. Bengtson, Medford, chairman of the House Alcoholic Control Com-

mittee, told the committee yesterday. Henderson ruled that a club could not have a club license unless it serves at least two meals a day. Many of the clubs, including most fraternal organizations which have liquor licenses, serve only one meal a day. The committee said it would work toward getting a clearer interpretation of what a club is. The committee held a hearing today on four bills which would prohibit minors in places where liquor is consumed, allow local option in precincts, eliminate women bartenders, and restrict the

Japan Marriages Now Streamlined

TOKYO, Feb. 6.—(AP)—A repatriated soldier who wanted a wife walked into the Japanese government's lonely hearts matchmaking office in a big department store and sat down on a hard bench beside a girl who wanted a husband.

A few minutes later they were bowing low to each other, stolid faced and a little grim in so romantic a moment, the girl in her kimono, the man in his neat western suit. Both were office clerks; she was 24 and he 30.

They simply had applied a few weeks ago for mates. The Marriage Bureau, consulting its filing system, picked them as a suitable pair.

This is streamlined marriage in the new Japan.

They will meet again after a week or a month they will decide whether they like each other. If they think they can hit it off, they will take three drinks of sake out of red lacquer wedding cups and tell their war office they are married.

The Marriage Bureau, maintained by the national welfare office since 1939, registers at least 70 men and women weekly. But only about 14 of them find mates.

Flying Cadet Training Reopened to Enlistees

Reopening of aviation cadet training to qualified regular Army Air Force enlistees was announced recently by the War Department, according to a directive received here from the U. S. Army Recruiting office in Eugene.

Enlisted men currently on active duty with the air force will be selected as aviation cadets for a course in pilot training, the directive states, and upon successful completion of the 52 weeks course may be commissioned as second lieutenants and placed on flying status.

To be eligible, an applicant must be in the air force in the U. S., unmarried, between the ages of 18 and 26, a high school graduate and pass such mental, aptitude, physical and character examinations as prescribed by the commanding general of the air force. Also the applicants must be enlistees for a three-year period and have at least two years of service to fulfill.

World Now Market for Oregon Dairy Products

PORTLAND, Feb. 6.—(AP)—Oregon dairy products are being marketed all over the world, the Dairy Cooperative Association was told at its annual meeting here.

Russell Waltz, Seattle, said a large amount of evaporated milk was being sold in the Philippines. "We have developed markets in South America and Alaska and have some outlets in Africa and China," he added. "We also are reviving milk powder contacts in Atlantic Coast markets."

Arthur Ireland, Forest Grove, was elected president of the cooperative. A 25 per cent increase in membership in the last two years was reported, with 3,717 shippers now on the books. The 1946 volume of business totaled \$11,345,921.
