amount for each." Magnuson told a reporter that permitting taxpayers to cut \$200 from taxes would be part of his bill intended to simplify filing and calculation of income taxes. His proposal, he said, will base the tax on the gross net income of each taxpayer, allowing as the only deductions \$500 for each dependent and any hospital and doctor bills.

He said he had not finally decided upon the exact amount of tax to propose in each income bracket as he was awaiting data from the Treasury Department to determine how much revenue his plan would raise.

The senator said he believed he would fix at two percent for amounts from \$2,400 to \$3,600; five per cent from \$3,600 to \$4,800; 10 per cent from \$4,800 to \$5,600; 20 per cent from \$5,600 to \$9,000; 25 per cent from \$9,000 to \$20,000; 35 per cent from \$20,000 to \$50,000 and 60 per cent on all income over \$50,000.

power poles. The plane indicated it was flying at 5,000 feet, according to the CAA operator here. Mount Richter rises to 4,700 feet at its peak. The plane crashed into the side of Diamond rock, a high elevation on the southwest slope of the mountain.

A rescue party was led to the plane wreckage yesterday by Ranger Milton Andrews of the Cow Creek district, Umpqua National Forest. Other Forest Service men in the party included Le Roy Lowell, scaler stationed at Divide Guard Station, and Bruce Ferguson, Bob Harris and Norman Krantz.

The two survivors of the plane were brought to Divide Guard Station, on the Tiller-Trail Highway, while en route to Medford. Forest Service officials in Roseburg were informed of their rescue last night by telephone from Divide Guard Station.

Also participating in rescue efforts were Sgt. Paul Morgan and Fred Perry, both of the state police at Roseburg.

amounts to a 170 per cent increase in benefits." "Chiseling" Denied The labor representatives hotly denied there are many "chislers" among workers. Stanley Earl, CIO representative, asserting "99.9 per cent of the workers would rather work than draw unemployment benefits." Earl and James T. Marr, state AFL president, said the increase is needed because of higher living costs, declaring a family could not survive on present benefits.

Both employers and labor agreed the proposed change would have little effect on the unemployment commission's \$70,000,000 trust fund.

Representatives of grocers and small retailers opposed the labor-sponsored bill to bring employers of one or more persons under the act, which now covers employers of four or more. They said it would mean added expense for them, while labor claimed that every worker has a right to be covered.
