The Rev. William H. Nagel, of Portland, representing the National Association of Evangelicals, will speak at 7:30 Thursday evening, at the First Presbyterian Church in Roseburg. Mr. Nagel is a former missionary to Europe and the Near East, where he worked before the outbreak of World War II. He is now executive secretary of the N. A. E. for the Pacific Northwest.

The National Association of Evangelicals is a cooperative fellowship of Bible-believing Christians, representing more than 27 denominations. It grew out of a conference of 15 men held in Chicago in October, 1941. Today it represents more than 3 million people.

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Compromise on Teachers' Salary Will be Proposed

EUGENE, Ore., Feb. 19. — (AP) — A compromise wage increase averaging \$663 annually, instead of the requested \$754, will be proposed by the Eugene school board to the city teachers at a general meeting tonight.

Superintendent Clarence Hines said the board's proposal would

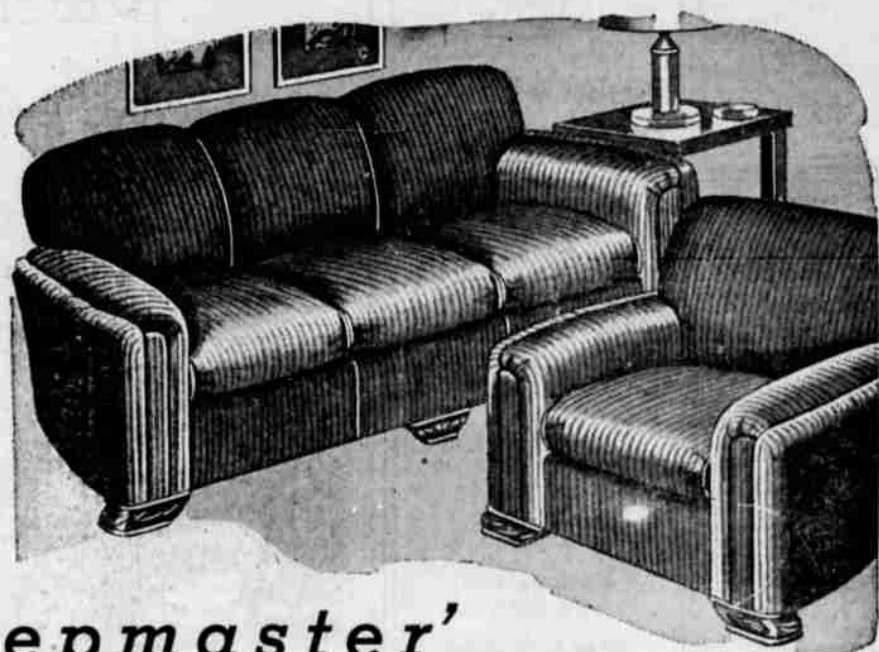
boost the school tax rate by about 7.3 mills. The teachers' proposal would mean an 8.6 mills increase, he said.

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
