Sen. Morse Issues Warning to GOP

NEW YORK, Feb. 19. (AP)—Republican party leaders should be told by the rank-and-file that

the party will be repudiated in 1948 if it returns to its "economic mistakes" of the 1920's, Sen. Wayne Morse (R-Ore.) said here last night.

In a dinner speech celebrating the 55th birthday anniversary of the late Wendell L. Willkie, Morse said Willkie recognized

that a party must first stand for sound principles and secondarily for election.

"He knew that standing for just anything for election's sake or order politically to capitalize upon the prevailing prejudices and misinformaton of the people, is the surest way to weaken and betray a political party," the Senator said.

Morse said he hoped the rank-and-file of the Republican party would recognize that the peace has not yet been won and that "we cannot afford to adopt a partisan course of action on the national budget or trade policies or international economic responsibilities."

No need to chop down a cherry tree to celebrate Washington's birthday. Just serve this luscious cherry-jelly roll. It's a celebration treat!

CHERRY LOG ROLL

3/4 cup Fisher's Blend flour 4 Eggs
3/4 tsp. double-acting Baking Powder 1/4 cup Sugar
1/4 tsp. Salt 1 tsp. Vanilla

Sift and measure flour. Combine baking powder, salt, and eggs in bowl. Place bowl in dishpan of boiling water. Beat with rotary beater until yolks are thick. Add sugar gradually, continuing to beat until mixture is very thick and lemon-colored. Remove bowl from hot water. Add vanilla. Fold in flour gradually with spatula, being careful not to overmix. Turn into 15x10-inch sheet pan lined with ungreased waxed paper or aluminum foil. Bake at 400° F. 12-13 min. Turn out carefully on cloth sprinkled with powdered sugar. Roll up in towel and let cool. Unroll, fill and roll again (not in towel).

CHERRY LOG FILLING

2 cups pitted sour Red Cherries 6 tablespoons Fisher's Blend flour
3/4 cup Sugar 2 tablespoons Butter or Margarine
1/4 tsp. Almond Extract
Drain juice from cherries. Add sugar and heat to boiling. Add flour combined with enough water to make a thin paste. Stir mixture constantly and let boil 5 minutes. Add butter, flavoring and cherries. Cool. Use as filling for sponge roll.
