**Communism Peril To  
U. S., Acheson Declares**

ing aid to Greece and Turkey. Acheson replied: "If the United States will not accede to the requests made on it, there will be a strong conviction throughout the world that a great deal of our professions are merely words."

**Secrets to Be Bared**

At the outset of today's testimony, Acheson quickly settled one issue which had developed between him and the lawmakers. He said he would arrange to make public later secret "background" documents concerning the situation in Greece and Turkey.

Acheson testified under questioning by Rep. Mundt (R-S. D.) that Soviet insistence on participation in the defense of the Dardanelles Straits is one of the "external pressures" on the government of Turkey.

One of the primary reasons the administration desires to provide aid to Turkey, he said, is to combat "external pressure." The under secretary added that there are no particular "internal pressures" on the Turkish government, but it is staggering under the load of maintaining a normal economy while also keeping armed forces in a state of semi-mobilization.

At one point yesterday, Rep. Merrow asked whether United States security would be threatened if Greece and Turkey collapsed and Russia became a Mediterranean nation.

Acheson said he would prefer not to reply. Merrow: "The people of the country want to know whether we are going to call the bluff of the Soviet Union. That's why I made the statement."

Acheson: "It's one thing for you to make that statement; it's another for me."

NEW YORK, March 21.—(AP)—The New York Times said today that "an authentic report" received in Washington stated that Communist bands in Greece had a strength of 13,000 and sought to "cut Greece in half."

The source of the report was not given. The Times' story, written from Washington by James Reston, said the immediate military objective of the armed bands was to establish a corridor from the Albanian border east to the Mount Olympus area on the Aegean sea.

In such an event, Greek Macedonia would be sandwiched between the corridor and Aegean to the south, with Yugoslavia and Bulgaria to the north and Albania on the west.

about \$16,000,000,000 annually. In the committee voting, one Democrat joined 15 Republicans in supporting the legislation. His name was not immediately disclosed.

Knutson predicted the House will approve the legislation by a comfortable margin, although Democrats on the committee organized their ranks for a last ditch battle.

They met with Democratic Floor Leader Sam Rayburn as the Republican-controlled committee went into session to approve a bill calling for a 30 per cent slash for small taxpayers and a 20 per cent cut for most others.

Rayburn told newsmen following the Democrats' meeting that they felt the entire matter of tax reduction should be deferred until congress has a better idea of the nation's fiscal situation and how much money will be appropriated.

"That will be the attitude of Democrats in the committee and in the House," he commented.

The Republicans counted on their five-man majority in the committee—made up of 15 Republicans and 10 Democrats—to drive through the income tax cut bill.

As approved by the Republican House steering committee yesterday, the bill gives a 30 per cent income tax slash to low-bracket taxpayers and a 20 per cent cut to most others. The original tax-cutting legislation was proposed by Chairman Knutson of the committee.

What Bill Provides. After the Steering Committee's action yesterday, a GOP spokes-

man outlined the provisions of the revised bill as follows:

1. Over 25,000,000 persons with taxable income of \$1,000 or less (gross income minus personal exemptions and deductions) would get a 30 per cent cut.

2. Other millions having income above \$1,395 and below \$302,000 would get a 20 per cent slash.

3. Those with taxable incomes between \$1,000 and \$1,395 would get a flat \$57 cut. This \$57 is the 30 per cent cut for a \$1,000 income and the "notch" provision was inserted to prevent inequal-

ities to persons with taxable incomes slightly above \$1,000.

4. An extra personal exemption of \$500 for persons over 65 years old remains in the bill, but a provision is inserted whereby these elderly persons can take this extra exemption only if they forego exemptions now in tax law on income from various annuities such as railroad retirement, social security and Army officer retirement.

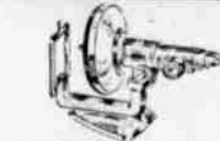
