DOWN in Louisiana, angry dairy farmers whose prices have been reduced are holding up milk trains and trucks by armed force and dumping their contents alongside the highways and the railroad rights of way, where the milk soaks uselessly into the ground.

The world needs milk, in vast quantities. For the lack of it, in many countries, babies are dying. You can't expect fathers and mothers, watching their babies die for lack of enough milk, to think very straight or very soundly.

Lack of sound, straight thinking, more than anything else, is leading us toward war in an atomic age, when war will be horrible beyond the present power of human beings to understand.

THE blame for all these things will be variously placed, according to the PREJUDICES of those who are doing the placing, but all sensible people should agree that we OUGHT to find a better way to settle our differences.

In fact, many thoughtful people are becoming convinced that if we DON'T find a better way our hopes for a better, happier world can't possibly be realized.

## A NOTHER thought:

Suppose you were the top communists who rule Soviet Russia and were planning the downfall of the United States of America and all other countries with capitalist economies—  
Wouldn't you be as pleased as Punch by developments such as these?

COMMUNISM is a way of life. Capitalism is a way of life. Capitalism is OUR way of life. Most of us are so passionately sure that our way of life is better than communism that if need be we will fight another war rather than submit to having communism forced upon us.

## A GREAT OPPORTUNITY

One patient died and 357 narrowly escaped death when fire destroyed one wing of the Western Washington hospital for mental wards at Steilacoom, Wash., Tuesday. The tragedy in Washington should be of great concern to Oregonians, who have recently had-called to their attention, through a series of feature articles in the *Oregon Journal*, the deplorable conditions found in the public institutions of our own state. Perhaps the Washington asylum fire, which fortunately had a surprisingly low death toll, will cause our state legislature and Oregon's voters to give more serious consideration to acquisition of Camp White hospital at Medford as a more suitable and safe place in which to house the state's mental patients.

Camp White is obtainable as a gift from the U. S. government. The State Board of Control has been authorized to study practicability of acquisition. Tentative reports have been submitted and the matter now is before the legislature for determination.

Camp White hospital has a present day valuation of from \$6 to \$8 million. The State Board of Control estimates cost of from \$1,298,090 to \$1,872,090 to remodel the hospital for occupancy and use of mental patients.

Admittedly our present state hospitals are inadequate and must be enlarged, modernized, fireproofed, etc. The state already has set aside funds for a building program. We now have an opportunity to acquire a thoroughly modern and suitable hospital at no original cost, with an outlay of slightly more than \$1 million for remodeling. The opportunity, we believe, is one which should be seized without delay.

Commenting upon the criticism by the Board of Control, *Oregon Journal* said recently:

In their number one report, designed to show whether or not the \$6 million military hospital is suitable (on a gift basis) as a new home for Fairview, they come to the conclusion it is neither suitable nor economically feasible to pick up Fairview home for the feeble minded and set it down at Camp White, even if Fairview buildings were turned over to Oregon State hospital for spreading-out purposes. They document this conclusion profusely—a little too profusely for our money—but logically, placing the emphasis on cost. . . .

In their number two, or alternate report, made at the suggestion of Secretary of State Farrel, the experts come to the equally logical conclusion that Camp White can be converted into a suitable institution for custodial type patients from Oregon State Hospital, Eastern Oregon State Hospital and Fairview home, eliminating the necessity for a big farming operation at Medford and making possible elimination of certain ward buildings now planned for seniles and incurable, untrainable patients at the three existing hospitals. Again, the emphasis is on money instead of humanity. . . .

The salient fact is that the report shows Camp White hospital is feasible for state use; that it can be employed to give decent care to approximately 1,000 of the state's aged and helpless mental cases, and that its use for this purpose will enable the state to relieve some of the unpardonable congestion now existing at Oregon State Hospital, Fairview and Eastern Oregon State Hospital, and do a decent treatment, training job.

Washington's tragedy, the expose of conditions existing in our own state institutions, the need for expansion in keeping with increasing population, and the demand from our own conscience that we surround our helpless wards with the utmost in safety, sanitation, comfort and convenience, should give us food for thought transcending provincialism and local pride which would hold state institutions for the advantage of any one particular section.

## Oregon Airplane Wreck Deaths Show Increase

PORTLAND, March 27. (AP)—Airplane accidents so far this year have killed 16 persons in Oregon—twice as many as died in the whole of 1946.

Civil Aeronautics Administration officials said five of this year's seven fatal accidents were "inexcusable pilot errors." They accounted for 13 deaths.

The other two accidents accounted for three fatalities—two student pilots dying in a mid-air collision, and an Army reserve pilot perishing in the unexplained plunge of his plane into the Columbia River.

In addition there are two persons missing on flights over Oregon. A number of minor accidents, on which no figures are kept, injured others, the officials said.

## Bloodstains Add To Evidence In Yacht Deaths Case

SANTA ANA, Calif., March 28.

(AP)—Testimony of a police chemist that clothing and shoes of George Gollum, indicted with his fiancée in the yacht deaths of her parents, were stained with blood was disclosed today as the transcript of the grand jury's action was filed with the county clerk.

The filing came a few minutes after Gollum, 21, had been granted a delay in his arraignment and his 17-year-old girl friend, Louise Overell, had been certified to juvenile court on grand jury indictments charging murder.

They are accused of slaying Flannier Walter E. Overell and his wife, Beulah, whose bodies were found aboard Overell's 47-foot power cruiser after a dynamite blast in Newport Bay March 15.

Key witness, according to the transcript, was Ray Plinker, Los Angeles police chemist, who while examining a leather jacket identified as Gollum's declared: "As a result of my examination, I have been able to determine that the coat at one time was heavily contaminated with human blood."

Gollum, pre-medical student, and the girl he planned to marry on her 18th birthday April 30, declined to testify before the grand jury on advice of counsel.
