Ellsworth Urges Action On Vets Hospitalization

WASHINGTON, March 27. — (AP) — Rep. Ellsworth of Oregon urged the Veterans Administration today to act to relieve the situation in Washington and Oregon concerning hospitalization facilities for war veterans.

Ellsworth recalled that Camp White, in Oregon, had been suggested as a good place for caring for veterans. But, he said, the administration dropped the proposal because of the availability of facilities at Barnes General Hospital in Portland and the Seattle Naval Hospital in Seattle, and now he was advised that neither institution can be used because of lack of funds.

Ellsworth asked the Veterans Administration to let him know the comparative need for hospital and domiciliary facilities now as compared to a year ago, what additional facilities have been made available during the last year, to what extent the demand cannot be met, and its recommendations for relief of the situation in the Pacific Northwest.

Red Cross Agents Visit Roseburg

Plans for a home nursing class baby care and mother health, under sponsorship of the Douglas County Chapter of the American Red Cross, were told today by Miss Edna Venderberg, San Francisco, nursing field representative.

The class will be organized under direction of Miss Grace Buckley, recently appointed home nursing chairman of the Douglas County Chapter. The class will begin April 1 at the Red Cross rooms at the Roseburg Armory. Enrollment will be limited to young married couples.

Miss Venderberg was in Roseburg today to advise Mrs. Buckley in her new duties. Miss Venderberg is assigned by the American National Red Cross to aid the home nursing program in Oregon.

Boyd Burnside, disaster relief worker of the American National Red Cross, arrived here today from the flood area of Western Washington. He will consult with Fred Southwick, recently appointed disaster chairman for the Douglas County Chapter.
