PARKERHOUSE ROLLS

Mix Thoroughly—
1/4 cup sour milk or buttermilk, lukewarm
1/4 teaspoon soda
1 tablespoon sugar
3 tablespoons melted shortening
1 cake compressed yeast
1 egg

Sift and add to above. Mix to a smooth dough—
2 1/2 cups Crown Best Patent Flour
1 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon baking powder

Knead until smooth and elastic. Roll out 1/4 inch thick, cut with cookie cutter. Grease tops, cross center of each and fold over, then press together. Place on greased baking sheet, cover with damp cloth, let rise at 80 degrees to 90 degrees until light, about 50 minutes, bake at 425 degrees F. for about 15 minutes. Makes about twenty-four 2 1/2 inch rolls.
