The next meeting will be May 20 at 7:30 at the Masonic temple, at which time the Guardian Council will be installed.

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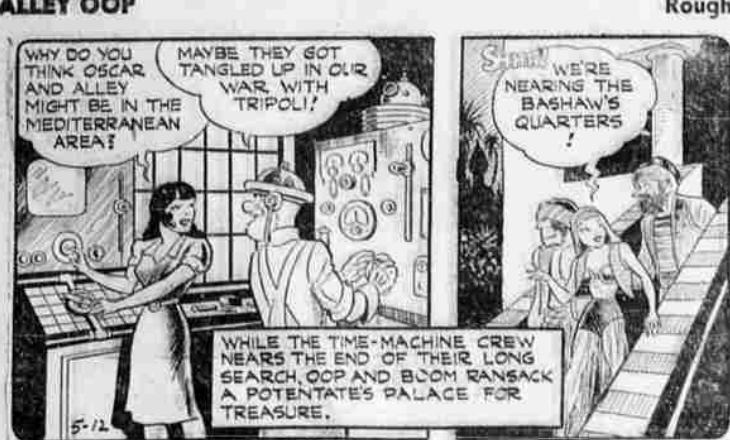
