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Lifer's Release Order Reversed

SALEM, Ore., May 20—(AP)—The State Supreme Court reversed today Circuit Judge Duncan of Salem, who ordered Ted Macomber released from the state penitentiary on grounds his conviction as a habitual criminal was irregular.

The high court's order means that Macomber, who was released a year ago, must go back to prison to serve the remaining 35 years of his 40-year sentence. Macomber, after having served sentences for grand larceny and assault with intent to rob, was convicted in Polk County of grand larceny in 1939, and sentenced to five years. In addition, since it was his third felony, Circuit Judge Walker of Dallas sentenced him to 40 years as an habitual criminal.

At the end of the five-year sentence for grand larceny last year, Macomber filed suit for habeas corpus in Judge Duncan's court, on grounds that the habitual criminal proceedings were irregular. Judge Duncan granted the writ and ordered the release of Macomber, whose whereabouts now are unknown.

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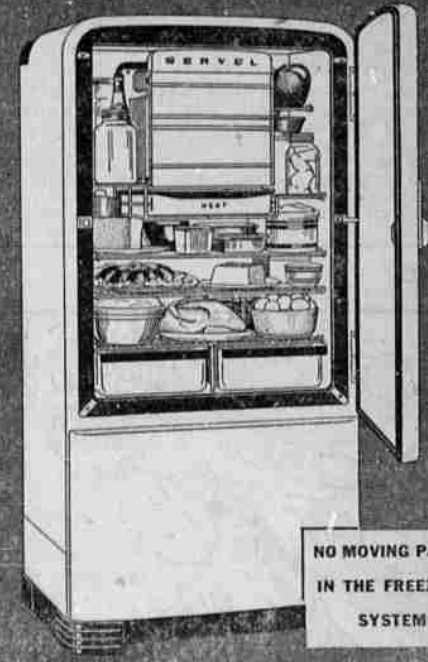
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
