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**Wallace's Talks Cited
As Freedom Example**

SEATTLE, May 30. — (AP) — The activities of Henry Wallace were cited by Federal Judge Lloyd L. Black yesterday as an example of the freedom enjoyed in the United States.

In a Memorial Day address before the Young Men's Democratic Club, Black said a Russian returning to his country to talk in a similar vein "probably wouldn't have been allowed two words and might have been dead within 25 minutes."

Wallace, he said, despite an open attack on President Truman's policies was given a full hearing and complete coverage by the press.

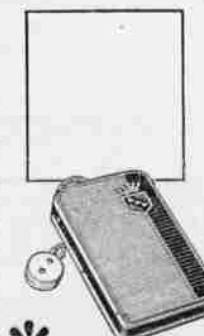


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
