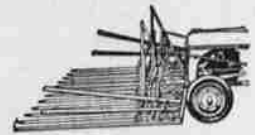

at a brief ceremony Thursday evening at the City hall.

The 30,000-mile endurance run, Cooper reports, has one purpose: a demonstration that automobiles may be driven under all conditions in a safe manner.

Twenty-eight drivers will operate the four cars making up the caravan. These drivers are not professionals, but for the most part are ex-servicemen from colleges and universities of California, Oregon and Washington. Eight state highway patrolmen will cooperate and travel in the cars to see that all traffic laws are obeyed. Drivers are instructed to observe all road courtesy, use all hand signals, and eliminate guess work in driving.

After reaching Seattle the cars will separate and travel a day apart, operating day and night until they have completed 10 round trips between Los Angeles and Seattle, a total of 30,000 miles. The test is expected to require six weeks' time.

The endurance run will be used at the same time to test various Union Oil Company products under all conditions of driving.

were made in Romania. Germans Flee Russians To Escape Labor in Mines

BERLIN, June 6.—(AP)—German Social Democratic sources said today they had information from the Russian occupation zone that hundreds of German youths were fleeing or going into hiding to escape being taken by the Russians for compulsory labor in uranium mines in Saxony, near the Czechoslovakian border.

According to these sources, the Russians are working uranium mines south of the industrial city of Aue with such haste that frequent increases in mining personnel are necessary. They said that about 30,000 German miners are working there now and that about a month ago 4,000 Germans were brought from the Dresden area for compulsory work.
