Sales Tax Opposed By
Unit of Oregon AFL

BEND, Ore., June 9. — (P) — The state Federation of Labor opened its annual convention here today.

The Oregon State Building and Construction Trades Council, which met here yesterday before the general AFL session, voted down — by three votes short of the required two-thirds majority — a proposal to raise its per capita tax by about 3 per cent.

The council declared opposition to the sales tax, championed the Wagner-Ellender-Taft housing measure, and pledged support to the campaign to obtain more funds for McNary dam.

Gaarenstrom Now
Vets' Affairs Head

SALEM, Ore., June 7. — (P) — William F. Gaarenstrom of Portland has been appointed state director of veterans affairs to succeed Col. George Sandy, who resigned Friday because of ill health. Gov. Snell announced today.

Gaarenstrom is at present assistant director of the department and head of the Portland branch office. He will assume his new role on Monday.

The new director is a native of St. Paul, Minn. Where he graduated from the St. Paul College of Law. Prior to entering service he worked as a public accountant, and entered the Army in 1942. He served in the infantry until an injury caused him to be transferred to the finance department.

Subsequent to his discharge, he became executive secretary of the Oregon War Veterans Service Committee, serving until June 1945, when the Department of Veterans Affairs was created.

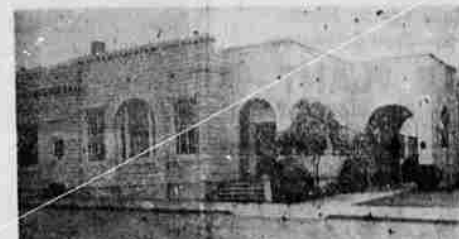
