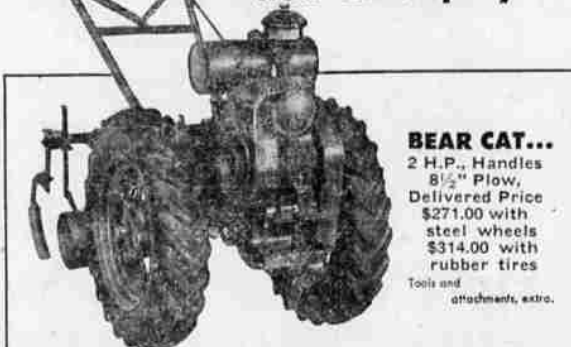

Mayor Flegel's Mother Passes On

Mayor Albert G. Flegel and his brother, Earl C. Flegel of Roseburg, were called to Portland Monday for the funeral of their mother, Mrs. Austin F. Flegel, Sr., who died Saturday.

Mrs. Flegel, who died at the age of 82, was first secretary of the League of Oregon Voters, president of the Waverly Baby Home, Portland, for the last 10 years, and was active in the Methodist Church and the D.A.R.

She came to Oregon with her husband, Austin F. Flegel, Sr., who practiced law in Portland for 30 years, in 1888. Mr. Flegel died in 1926.

Six sons and two daughters survive: Austin F. Flegel, Jr., Portland; Earl C. Flegel, Roseburg; Miss Dorothy Flegel, Portland; Paul C. Flegel, Berkeley, Calif.; Mrs. George Jacroix, Honolulu, T. H.; Irvine Flegel, Spokane; Albert G. Flegel, Roseburg; and Arthur Flegel, Longview.

Ten grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren also survive.

Elementary School Diploma Given Man, 79

CHICAGO, June 12.—(AP)—Allen Smith, 79, the father of eight children, received his elementary school diploma at graduation exercises last night and told his teachers he plans to enroll in high school next September.

Officials at Phillips Evening School said Smith had a perfect attendance record for the four years he has been enrolled. He attended classes two hours four evenings weekly for 36 weeks.

Smith, a retired odd jobs man, was born Dec. 5, 1867, at Tuskegee, Ala., of parents who had been slaves only a few years earlier.
