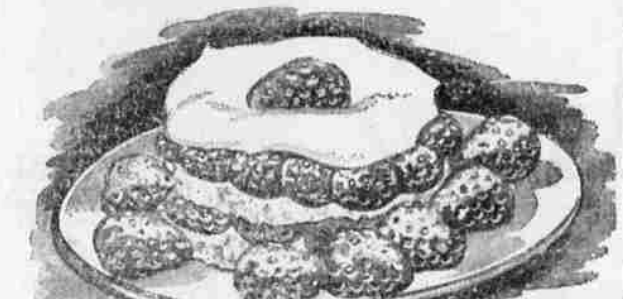

STRAWBERRY SHORTCAKE

Sift together— 2 cups Crown Pastry Flour
2 tablespoons sugar
1/4 teaspoon salt
3 teaspoons baking powder

Cut in till fine— 4 tablespoons shortening

Beat together lightly— 1 egg
2/3 cup milk

Add beaten liquid to above mixture, bring together with as little mixing as possible. Knead lightly, roll out to fit 8-inch layer, can or cut into biscuit form, bake at 425 deg. F. for about 15 minutes. Cut layer or biscuits in half, add strawberries between layers and on top of layer. Top with whipped cream and serve.
