support as a part of our check-communism policy. WATCH Italy. If the Italian communists (Moscow directed) succeed in taking over Italy, we will be effectively fenced off from Greece and Turkey.

Already Greece and Turkey are mere isolated outposts and France has become our defense against the spread of communism. That is where we shall have to make our stand.

ON the other side of the world, a Chinese (Nationalist) government spokesman asserts that whatever happened in Sinkiang was "no ordinary frontier incident" and charges Russia with partial responsibility for Outer Mongolia's "invasion" of this far western Chinese province.

Just what happened is obscure—as these things always are—There was some sort of border ruckus. The Mongols accuse the Chinese of arresting eight Mongol soldiers. A detachment of their cavalry rode into Sinkiang to force their release.

Some kind of scrap followed. The Chinese claim the Russian warplanes that accompanied the invaders got confused and dropped bombs on their own people, killing quite a few of them. What really happened, we can only guess.

The Chinese foreign office spokesman says: "While our local military authorities have been ordered to exercise all possible restraint in defense of their position, the (Chinese) government has instructed its ambassador in Moscow to protest to the Soviet government as well as to Outer Mongolia through its minister."

KEEP your fingers crossed and watch. Maybe Russia is really reaching over to take another bite out of China. Maybe she is only running a bluff on us—telling us in this way that if we get too cozy in Europe she can take a hand in the Asiatic poker game also.

The point is that both in Europe and in Asia Russia is moving to checkmate our new stop-communism policy. How far she will move her men on the board remains to be seen. Her advantage is that her moves are being made close to her own home base, whereas we are compelled to move at great distances.

Our BEST move is to strengthen ourselves in every possible way in our own home territory. If we straighten out our home situation, restoring our staggering vast production system to full efficiency, Russia will think twice before doing anything that might start the shooting.

If our production system is permitted to go to pot, Russia will move forward confidently to communize the world.
