Casey Jones First Money Winner On Motorcycle Bill

Casey Jones, Eugene Motorcycle Club entry, yesterday won first money in the Class A Main event of Roseburg's King Cobra Club Tourist Trophy Classic at Edenbower Speedway, before approximately 2,500 spectators.

Astride a special built Harley-Davidson bike, Jones toured the four-tenths mile oval in 28.85 seconds, for the day's best time trials run, won first in the initial heat of five laps and circled the dirt track to pass opposing riders from a handicapped fifth place to take first in the main event of the day.

Jones broke the tape in the long and strenuous 12-lap race after a near-collision in the seventh stretch on the track's treacherous final turn with Ray Hyland, who was forced out of the running with engine trouble.

Following Jones in the day's thriller, were: second, Ray Wolfe, Eugene, on an English MANX; third, Hubert Simmons, Coos Bay; fourth, Roy Burke, Portland; fifth, Harry Accenzia, Portland.

Although no serious casualties resulted, a host of topflight professional riders from throughout the state caused each other plenty of trouble in the consolation, Class B and Class A races which followed seven equally hair-raising qualifying heats.

In the consolation race, the real thrills began as Jon Skinner, Eugene, and Joe Dolan, North Bend, ran neck-and-neck on their English model bikes through the seventh circle, collided, each hit the dirt, and Skinner righted himself in time to whizz to a third place behind Jim Garber, Oregon City, and Morris Britton, Eugene.

Gene Thielson, Eugene, caused a mild sensation among spectators as his English AJS spun a 360 degree movement on the track's lower stretch and continued down the home path to finish fourth in the fifth heat.

Best clocked times of the 25 competing riders were turned in by Jones 28.85, Roy Burke, Portland, 30.2, and Hubert Simmons, 31.10, for the 4 1/2 mile track.

Roseburg Legion Juniors Defeat Sutherlin, 8 to 3

Limiting Sutherlin's American Legion Juniors to a single hit, Roseburg Legion Juniors won an 8-3 decision at Finlay Field Saturday afternoon before a sparse crowd.

Second county conference tilt of the season for the Roseburg club, and the first for the Sutherliners, the contest was interesting throughout as Roseburg's pitching power brought dividends and inexperience proved fatal to the losers.

Catch George Erickson especially commended Dave Piper, shortstop, and Harold Stumbo, first baseman, for their fine performance on infield work.

Chuck Scofield, hurling his first game in two years of Legion Junior and high school ball, tossed eight innings of no-hit baseball. He allowed only a single to Plueard, Sutherlin catcher, in the fourth, which was stretched into a run on a fielder's choice.

Roseburg put in a scoreless first frame against Pitcher Redding, but tallied once off two hits in the second and hit twice in the third to send L. Stumbo, Sanders, Cornut, Scofield and Dorkson scampering home for five additional markers.

Sutherlin came back in their half of the third with two runs, accounted for by Musgrove, right-fielder, and Lang, secondbase, who both got on via walks.

Sutherlin's Redding held Roseburg in the fifth to a single bingle by Mathews, as L. Stumbo walked and Sanders popped out to retire the side.

In their portion of the fifth, Sutherlin acquired its third score of the game off a single by Plueard, catcher, but failed to threaten Roseburg, as Redding flew out, Hasket grounded out and Morton popped up.

Cornut got on off a fielder's choice in the sixth with Edgar getting thrown out at second and scored off a hit by H. Stumbo for the Roseburg final tally.

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New Tractor for Smaller Farms On Display Here

A new general-purpose tractor, designed primarily for small farms, is now being shown at Interstate Tractor and Equipment Co., 709 N. Jackson St., Roseburg.

The tractor is one of the first to come off the assembly line of the new \$10,000,000 John Deere tractor factory recently completed at Dubuque, Iowa.

"This is the new tractor John Deere engineers have been developing and testing all through the war years," says Jack Fincham, local Interstate manager.

"It offers many of the time-proven features of previous John Deere small-farm tractors plus new power, new ease of handling, more comfort for the operator, and a complete line of new working tools that are easier to attach and detach, and easier to control from the tractor seat."

The name "Quick-Tatch" emphasizes the ease and speed with which integral tools such as plow, cultivator, bedder, planter, may be attached. "Touch-o-matic" describes the new precision hydraulic lift for raising and lowering the tools and regulating working depth.

While this tractor is of interest to farmers, vegetable growers, and orchardists, with smaller acreages who are now using animal power, it also meets the needs on larger farms as auxiliary power to help out at cultivating and haying time and to do many of the lighter jobs for which a team has been kept.

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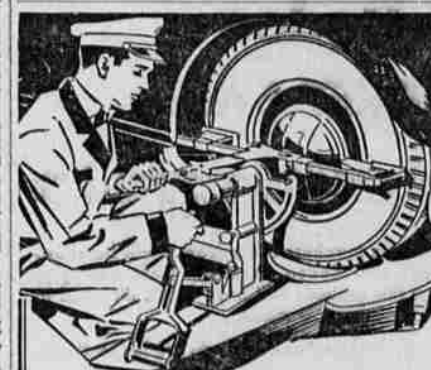
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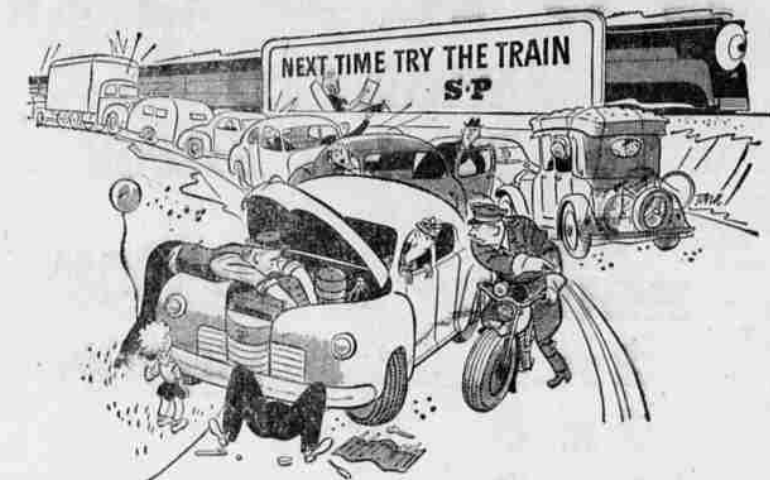
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
