

Auto Machinists' Jobs Opened To Examinations

Federal Civil Service announces examinations for probational appointments to various automotive machinists positions with the Bonneville Power Administration, U. S. Department of Interior, in the states of Oregon, Idaho, Washington and Western Montana.

Persons who desire permanent positions will have an opportunity to file for a civil service examination leading to probational appointment with permanent classified civil service status in their respective positions.

Applicants for these examinations will be graded on the basis of their experience, education and training. No written test is required.

Applicants must be between the ages of 18 and 62, except that these age limits may be waived for veterans. Applications must be received by the Board of U. S. Civil Service Examiners, Bonneville Power Administration, P. O. Box 3537, Portland, Ore., not later than July 2, 1947.

Open positions and hourly rates of pay are:

Machinist, automotive, helper, \$1.35; machinist automotive, \$1.68; automotive mechanic, \$1.68; auto body and fender, \$1.68; auto electrical and fuel,

\$1.68; motor machinist, \$1.68; welder (automotive), \$1.68.

PORTLAND, June 18. (AP)—Police today sought a hold-up man who took \$1,300 in cash from a variety store in suburban Portland yesterday.

Warner F. Livingston, the store owner, said he was alone, unpacking merchandise, when a man thrust a hard object—presumably a gun—at Livingston's back and locked him in the back room.

The money was taken from the cash register.

Price Support For Dry Peas Arranged

CORVALLIS, Ore., June 18. (AP)—The price support program for crop thresher run dry edible peas will be carried out through purchase agreements with growers, the Oregon State College extension service reported.

Last year the program operated through dealers.

The OSC report said its data were based on Department of Agriculture market reports and other sources and indicated the following schedule:

Peas which would grade U. S. No. 2 or better after normal cleaning will be eligible for support at 90 per cent of comparable price as of July 1—thus the amount in terms of money will not be available until about that date.

Dry peas grading No. 1 will be supported at 25 cents per 100

pounds higher than those grading No. 2.

The price support agreements will provide for purchase at support prices by the Commodity Credit Corporation with delivery as late as May 1948.

UMPIRES PRAISED

Neuner Raps Astoria Plan To Permit Slot Machines

ASTORIA, Ore., June 18. (AP)—The City of Astoria has no right to license slot machines and if it does the sheriff should confiscate them, Attorney General Neuner has written District Attorney Garnet Green in a letter read to the City Commission here.

Noting a news story regarding a proposed city ordinance to license private clubs, based on the number of slot machines they operate, Neuner wrote that "I do not believe this office should stand idly by and permit the constitution to be flouted without raising our voice in opposition to such an unlawful procedure."
