GOP President in 1948 Predicted by Reece

SALEM, Ore., June 21.—(AP)—Predicting a long era of prosperity for the West and a Republican president in the White House in 1948, Carroll Reece, chairman of the Republican National Committee, paid a formal call on Gov. Snell at the executive office in the statehouse today.

"Everywhere I have visited on my western tour I have found strong Republican sentiment," Reece declared. "So there apparently is no reason why the situation should change between now and the next presidential election."

He hinged his prediction of western prosperity on the "unlimited water power, natural resources and industrial development of the area."

Death Beats Father in Race for Incubator

SEDRÖ WOOLLEY, Wash., June 21.—(AP)—A father's race to secure a badly-needed incubator failed to save the life of his newly-born daughter.

The infant died about midnight seven hours after she had been born by caesarian operation.

The father, Robert Taylor, jumped in his truck and headed for Seattle when he learned that his child's condition required an incubator and the only one in Sedro Woolley was in use. Taylor, escorted by state patrolmen, King County deputy sheriffs and Seattle police, made the 140-mile round trip in a little more than two hours.

Notice is hereby given that a Special Election will be held in the City of Roseburg, Douglas County, Oregon, on the 1st day of July, 1947, which shall be held at the City of Roseburg, Oregon, in the following manner:

Shall a special tax levy in the sum of \$25,000.00 over and above the amount provided for in the Charter of the City of Roseburg, Oregon, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1947, made necessary on account of necessary increase in salaries, change of form of Government, and in City Manager, additional expense in employees and variations in expenses made necessary by the increase of costs and the growth of the City.



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NOTICE OF INTENTION TO IMPROVE SOUTH JACKSON STREET

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that at a meeting of the Common Council of the City of Roseburg, Oregon, held on June 19, 1947, the following Resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS, That the Common Council of the City of Roseburg, Oregon, deems it expedient and necessary to improve South Jackson Street from the South line of Rice street to the South City Limits in the City of Roseburg, Oregon, in the following manner:

First: By grading said street to the proper grade.

Second: By graveling and surfacing and tilling with two coats of road oil the roadway of said street forty (40) feet width.

Third: By constructing concrete sidewalks on both sides five (5) feet in width.

Fourth: By construction of sub-drains, if necessary.

Fifth: By constructing street monuments, if necessary.

Sixth: By laying vitrified sewer pipe if necessary.

Seventh: By constructing catch basins if necessary.

Eighth: By constructing concrete curbs and gutters on both sides.

Said improvements are to be made in accordance with the Charter and Ordinances of the City of Roseburg, Oregon, and the grade, plans, specifications and estimates of the City Engineer filed in the office of the City Recorder on the 20th day of January, 1947, which said grade, plans, specifications and estimates, are hereby approved and adopted.

The entire costs of said improvements, including engineering, interest and all other expenses which the City of Roseburg would not have incurred except for the making of said improvements shall be levied upon the property especially benefited thereby as provided by the Charter of the City of Roseburg, Oregon, and in accordance with the petition of property owners and no part thereof shall be paid by the City of Roseburg.

The estimate of the City Engineer of the probable detailed cost of said improvement is the sum of \$2,500.00.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City Recorder be and he is hereby directed to give notice of said improvement as provided by the Charter of the City of Roseburg, Oregon.

Remonstrances against said proposed improvement may be filed in writing with the undersigned within twenty (20) days from the first publication of this notice, which is the 23rd day of June, 1947.
