A number of improvements and additions to the buildings and grounds were noted this year and the affair proved to be one of the most enjoyable to date.

The school of instruction opened Thursday morning with Lee Harter, state conservation warden, in charge of the topics, "Public relations" and reports regarding fires, permits, etc. In the afternoon, Gene Mannock, Cottage Grove, gave instruction on map reading, maintenance of equipment and buildings, radio procedure, fire reports and forms.

Friday, the group received training in fire fighting, mapping of fires, radio reporting, etc. at Landers Lookout. Gene Mannock was in charge of the school; Leland Harter gave instruction in fire location principles of training and personnel management. Leslie C. Cummings, state inspector, reported on law enforcement and H. H. Turner, training officer and supply manager assisted in the demonstrations. C. A. Woolley, Portland, talked on fire chasing problems and Bud Richards, assistant to Fred L. Southwick, and James Walker had charge of the instruction on progressive method of fire-fighting and control of fires.

Saturday morning, lookout training was discussed by C. A. Woolley with Lee Beyers talking on fire organization and fire control.

This year the Association has 52 boys in four camps located at Fiddle, South Myrtle, Drain and Hinkley Creek.

Other prize winners in the Roseburg Parade were Lou "Here Comes Franco," for the best home drawn vehicle, and the Melody Mountain Boys for the best cowboy band.

The best dressed western couple, Mrs. Lloyd Sencer and her son Bob, of Umpqua, A. M. Thompson of Tillamook, first name not learned—were the best Indian costume.

Represented in the colorful parade were riding clubs from Douglas, Lane, and Coos counties, including both the Douglas and Lane County Sheriff's Poses.

High Court Rules On Trial Issues

WASHINGTON, June 24. —(AP) — The Supreme Court yesterday established important precedents as to trial rights of persons accused of crimes.

It upheld New York State's "blue ribbon jury" procedure. Another upheld the California law which permits the prosecutor to comment to the jury on that fact, if the defendant does not take the stand.

Both these procedures had been attacked as violations of the constitution's guarantee of trial by due process of law.

Joseph S. Fay and James Bove, labor union officials convicted of extorting money from contractors, protested the "blue ribbon jury." They said it meant they were tried by persons drawn from "the upper stratum of economic and social life." They said they would have been acquitted by a jury representing a cross-section of the public. They were sentenced to terms of eight and one-half to 16 years in prison each.

In the California case, the court affirmed the murder conviction of Admiral Dewey Adamson, a Negro accused of slaying Mrs. Stella Maxwell, a 61-year-old widow. He did not take the witness stand and the prosecutor called the jury's attention to that fact.

New Enlistment Terms Offered by U. S. Navy

The new terms of enlistment in the regular Navy, as announced by the Bureau of Navy Personnel, are as follows: Men reenlisting in the U. S. Navy within three months from date of discharge from the Navy, may do so

for a term of two, three, four or six years at the option of the applicant.

Men reenlisting regardless of length of time since last discharge, and young men enlisting for the first time may enroll for a term of three, four and six years at the option of the applicant.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO IMPROVE SOUTH JACKSON STREET

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that at a meeting of the Common Council of the City of Roseburg, Oregon, held June 18, 1947, the following Resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS, That the Common Council of the City of Roseburg, Oregon, deems it expedient and necessary to improve South Jackson Street from the South line of Rice Street to the South line of Rice Street in the City of Roseburg, Oregon, in the following manner:

First: By grading said street to the proper grade.

Second: By grading and oiling the roadway of said road forty (40) feet in width.

Third: By constructing a concrete sidewalk five (5) feet in width on the East side of said street.

Fourth: By constructing sub-drains if necessary.

Fifth: By constructing street monuments.

Sixth: By laying vitrified sewer pipe if necessary.

Seventh: By constructing catch basins if necessary.

Eighth: By constructing concrete curbs and gutters on both sides of said street.

Said improvements are to be made in accordance with the Charter and Ordinances of the City of Roseburg, Oregon, and the grade, plans, specifications and estimates of the City Engineer filed in the office of the City Recorder on the 20th day of January, 1947, which said grade, plans, specifications and estimates, are hereby approved and adopted.

The entire costs of said improvements, including engineering, interest and all other expenses which the City of Roseburg would not have incurred except for the making of said improvements shall be levied upon the property especially benefited thereby as provided by the Charter of the City of Roseburg, Oregon, and in accordance with the petition of property owners to be benefited by said improvement, and no part thereof shall be paid by the City of Roseburg.

The estimate of the City Engineer of the probable detailed cost of said improvement is the sum of \$5,365.00.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City Recorder be and he is hereby directed to give notice of said improvement as provided by the Charter of the City of Roseburg, Oregon.

Remonstrances against said proposed improvement may be filed in writing with the City Recorder.
