Forests Provide Cheap Vacation For Americans

WASHINGTON—If you want a cheap vacation take to the woods. They're yours—179 million acres of them. Lots of Americans are doing it this year.

These are the acres of the national forests, scattered over 42 states, Puerto Rico and Alaska. In them there are places to pitch a tent, park a trailer, or to picnic.

In them you can find almost any kind of a vacation you want. There's hiking, and mountain climbing, fishing, bicycling swimming, boating, motoring.

The Forest Service of the U. S. Department of Agriculture, which takes care of these wooded areas, reports more than 18,000,000 visits to this national vacationland from January 1 through December 31, 1946.

The picnic grounds, tent camp sites, organization camps and summer homes are all provided with safe drinking water, fireplaces and fire wood, tables and benches and sanitary facilities.

Some Lack Comforts
The Forest Service warns visitors, however, that they should not expect too much in the way of service in some areas. In the war personnel and funds were not available to keep things up to snuff.

Nevertheless, Consumer's Guide, a Department of Agriculture monthly publication, waxed poetic in describing the forest lands.

"There's wood-scented air to breathe, and the unending surge of wind in the treetops to hear. Best of all, in many camps there's the sight of blue and gray and purple mountains rising fold on fold to lean against the pale horizon."

100,000 Acres Available
About 100,000 acres have been set aside as "recreation areas" in the national forests.

Take the Shesler lake forest campground in the George Washington National Forest, Virginia, for instance. It has 500 acres and camping sites for 24 tents.

Vets' Disability Ratings Reviewed Under New Rules

About 36 per cent of the disability ratings for veterans living in Oregon have been reviewed under new rating schedules approved by Congress last year. Those A. Collins and Clifford Fields, Veterans Administration contact representatives for Roseburg pointed out today.

A VA regional office report shows that 10,903 compensation cases out of a total of 30,063 have been rechecked since last August. All claims are reviewed automatically and any award in-

creases are retroactive to April 1, 1946.

Both Collins and Fields urged that disabled veterans not make inquiries while their case reviews are still pending. Compensation is based on disability percentage rating and the new schedule is resulting in more increases than decreases.

A more accurate evaluation of veterans' disabilities is now possible, VA officials believe. New types of combat wounds and tropical diseases suffered in World

War II have been added to the schedule. Compensation ranges from \$13.80 a month for 10 per cent disability to \$138 a month for total disability. Some awards fixed by law for certain grave disabilities, such as blindness, loss of two or more limbs, or paraplegia, run as high as \$360 a month.

Virtually all disability ratings will be reviewed under the new schedule. About 21,000 of the 30,000 with such ratings have 10 per cent or greater disabilities and thus receive compensation.

Reforestation Expert Joins Douglas Assn.

Appointment of Theodore W. Maul, formerly of Placerville, Calif., as technical assistant in the Douglas Forest Protective Association was announced by Fred W. Southwick, supervising warden.

Maul, a graduate of Oregon State College, will be employed in reforestation projects, tree planting, and similar work. Maul was assigned here through the State Department of Forestry.
