POWER VERSUS FISH

The clash between the commercial fishing industry and exponents of public power, irrigation and navigation is reaching major proportions on the Columbia River.

A major concession has been offered by the Department of the Interior in a proposal that no additional main stream dams be built on the Columbia below Bridgeport, Washington, until 1958, other than those already proposed, together with further power installations at Grand Coulee, Rock Island, and Kerr dams.

During the intervening 10 years, it is proposed by the Department of the Interior that the Fish and Wildlife Service be authorized to make a full-scale study of the lower Columbia River fishery problem as affected by proposed construction of multiple-purpose dams.

The department's position is expressed in a recently released declaration of policy in which it is stated: The Department feels that the Columbia River fisheries should not be allowed indefinitely to block the full development of the other resources of the river.

Too many dams already have been built or planned without thought of preserving fishery or scenic resources. Government engineers have been going "hog wild" with plans for dam construction, proposing to harness every body of running water, without regard to cost or benefits.

There is no denying the need for adequate power, reclamation, irrigation, and navigational developments. The Pacific Northwest can become the world's industrial center when a huge supply of cheap power becomes available.
