

Douglas Youths To Attend Beaver Boys State Meet

The Beaver Boys State sponsored by the American Legion, Department of Oregon, will be held on the spacious grounds of Oregon State College at Corvallis, June 29 through July 6, according to Claude Baker, local chairman.

Boys State is a plan for training in the functional aspects of citizenship, Baker pointed out. It is a program of education sponsored by the American Legion with the purpose of teaching the youth of today "constructive attitudes" toward the American form of government.

Boys State attempts to show that "our scheme of government has not outworked its usefulness; that all a democracy needs is an intelligent citizenry and a clean, honest and impartial administration responsive to the will of the people," he said.

This program originated in Illinois in 1935, has been adopted by the national organization of the American Legion. The 1947 school will be the 11th session of Beaver State Boys State. More than 1,800 boys to date have attended the summer sessions.

Departure will be from in front of the courthouse Sunday morning, June 29. Baker said that the boys should take with them the following articles:

Also track or sports uniforms and shoes; any light sports equipment at hand; bedroom slippers; coat hangers; note books and pencils; musical instruments; camera; two sheets and one blanket.

Widow's Status Regarding Vets' Burial Changed

A remarried World War II widow of a member of the armed forces now interred overseas loses the right to decide where her former husband shall be finally interred. A widow who was divorced or separated from her husband at the time of his death, moreover, also forfeits this right.

These statements were made this week by Lt. Col. Vernon L. Lewis, chief of the American Graves Registration Division for the Pacific Northwest, Auburn, Wash. Lewis requested remarried widows of World War II deceased now interred overseas to write a letter to the Memorial Division, Quartermaster General, Washington 25, D. C., indicating their change of status.

Her own written statement to the effect that she has remarried will constitute proof that she is no longer the legal next of kin. The War Department will then determine the succeeding legal next of kin in accordance with the precedence established by the Secretary of War.

Interested parties should forward a certified copy of a widow's remarriage or divorce or remarriage record.

"When this is done," Lewis continued, "the letter of inquiry, together with inclosures explaining the final interment mission, automatically will be sent to the legal next of kin eligible to make the decision."

Title Elimination Bill Lists Seven Wrestlers Here

Jack Kiser, the flashy Portlander who bears the distinction of having been the youngest holder of the Pacific Coast light-heavyweight championship, will have an opportunity to retrieve the coveted "traveling trophy" wrestling trophy at the Roseburg Armory Saturday night.

Kiser is the only one of the seven competitors in the elimination tournament who has twice won the award and a third win will return the cup. The talented Portlander, however, will not be the favorite.

The favored role will be shared by three grapplers, namely, Al Szasz, the sensational young Hungarian who defeated Jack Carter here last week; Stocky Kneelson, the rough-and-tumble bewhiskered hillbilly from Tenmore, and Buck Weaver, the former Indiana football player who uses a formidable back-flipping flying mare.

Other contenders will be Carter, Leo Karlinko, the "Mad Russian" who joins Kneelson as one of the two villains, and Silent Hattan, the hard-working deaf and dumb matman from Oklahoma who will be making one of his infrequent appearances in the Northwest.

All seven grapplers will shoot the works in the elimination skirmishes because a \$200 purse and a trophy will be going to the winner. A Pacific Coast junior-heavyweight championship match against Herb Parks has also been promised the winner by Matchmaker Don Owen.

The bouts will be one fall or 15 minute limits, with three ringside judges giving any necessary decisions. After drawing for opponents at the ring at 8:30 P. M., three first-round matches will be staged, with one lucky wrestler drawing a bye. Winners of the first two matches will meet in one semi-final and the winner of the third match will vie against the man holding the bye in the other. The finale is certain to be packed with dynamite with fans assured of an exciting engagement regardless of the winner.

In the meantime, Kneelson, who lost to Tony Ross last week, is petitioning the Roseburg commission for a return bout with the "Salom Terror" with the referee of his choice working the match. He claims that Elton Owen, who will referee the entire tournament, "robbed" him last week.
