Central Point will provide the 4th of July fireworks for the Umpqua Chiefs tomorrow at 2 P. M. on Finlay Field in a Southern Oregon League makeup con-

test. Sunday the Chiefs play a rescheduled game with Hilt, Calif. The Pointers come to Roseburg as the underdogs of the circuit, holding a record of two wins and three losses. They have defeated Hilt 6-2 and Tri-City 4-3, and lost by close margins to Crescent City, Grants Pass and Medford.

After the Pointers beat Hilt 6-2, Hilt in turn dumped previously undefeated Grants Pass, 18-5; then, last week, Grants Pass edged out the stubborn Central Point

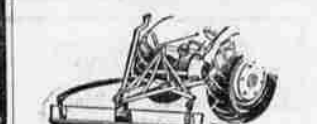

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the unregulated use of certain forest areas is, in the judgment of the State Forester, a menace to life and property due to conditions tending to cause or allow the rapid spread of fires which might occur or because of the inaccessible character of such areas due to the lack of suitable roads, and WHEREAS, upon the showing of the State Forester it appears to me to be necessary to close to unregulated use the following areas designated as:

AREA NO. R-1: All National Forests in Oregon and adjacent areas protected by the United States Forest Service as follows: Adjacent to Umpqua National Forest: Sections 30 to 33 inclusive, T. 23 S., R. 1 W.; Sections 1 to 6 inclusive, 8 to 16 inclusive, 21 to 28 inclusive, and 33 to 36 inclusive, T. 24 S., R. 1 W.; Sections 1, 2, 3, 10 to 15 inclusive, 22 to 27 inclusive, and 31 to 36 inclusive, T. 25 S., R. 1 W.; Sections 23 and 24, Sections 25 to 28 inclusive, and 33 to 36 inclusive, T. 26 S., R. 2 W.; Sections 31, Sections 34 and 35, T. 31 S., R. 3 W.; Sections 19, 25, 33, 35, and 36, T. 32 S., R. 3 W.; W. Section 6, T. 33 S., R. 2 W.; and N. Section 1, T. 33 S., R. 3 W.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Earl Snell, Governor of the State of Oregon, by virtue of the authority vested in me under the provisions of Section 107-210, Oregon Compiled Laws Annotated, as amended by Chapter 252, Oregon Laws, 1945, do hereby proclaim the unregulated use of the above-described areas to be unlawful and do hereby close said areas and the same shall be subject to use only upon condition that entrants shall comply with all of the following requirements or conditions:

(1) To refrain from smoking while traveling in such areas. (2) To secure a permit issued by the forester or a fire warden before building a campfire other than at improved, designated and posted campground on such areas. (3) To have as a part of his or her equipment when using campfires, except when traveling as a pedestrian, and/or camping at improved designated and posted campgrounds, tools as specified by the forester suitable for extinguishing fires. This proclamation shall be effective from and after the first day of July, 1947, and shall remain in full force and effect until and including the 31st day of December, 1947. Done at the Capitol in Salem, Oregon, this 28th day of June, 1947. Earl Snell, Governor. Attest: Robt. S. Farrell, Jr., Secretary of State.

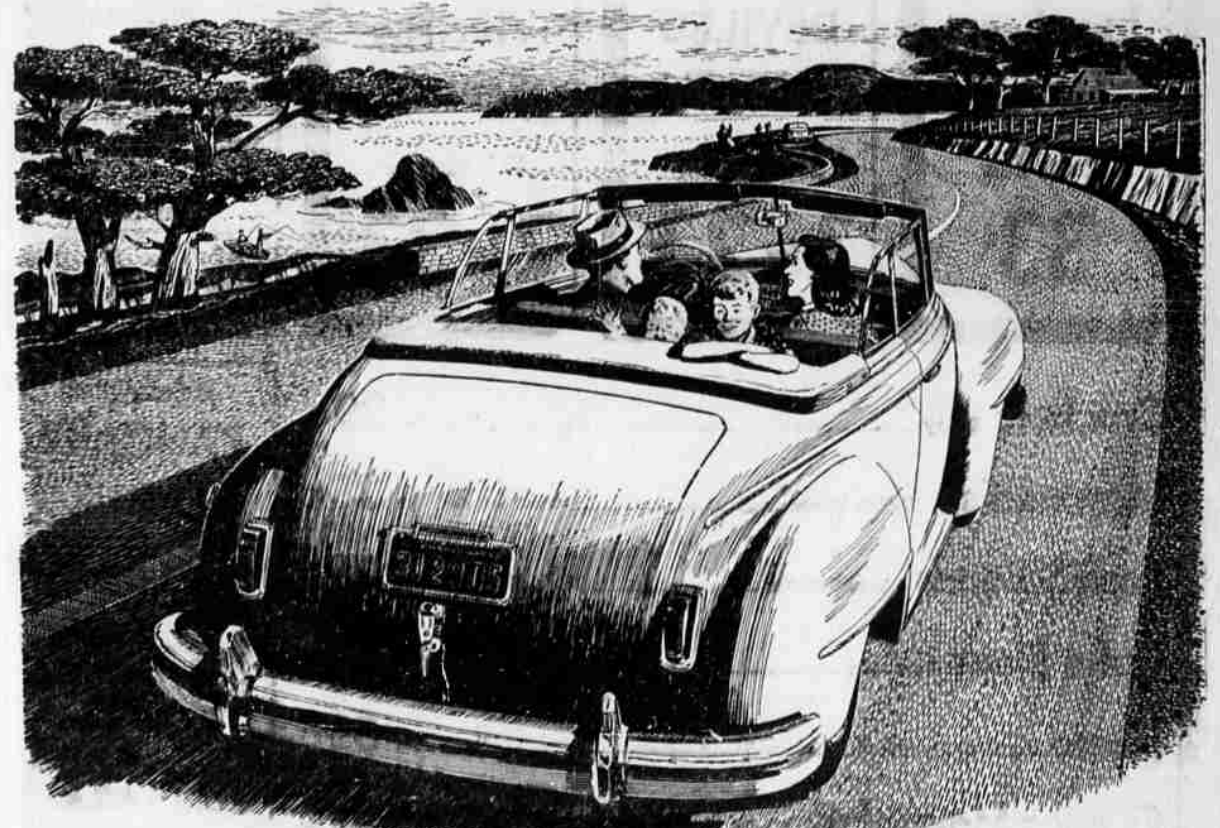
