**Oregon War Veteran Will be 105 Tomorrow**

**LEBANON, Ore., July 7.** — (P) — James W. Smith, who fought hostile Indians with Olney's Oregon cavalry during the Civil War and as an infant rode west with the emigrants accompanied by Marcus Whitman, will celebrate his 105th birthday here tomorrow.

The centennarian and Oregon pioneer proudly recalls his first vote — Republican in every election since — was cast for Abraham Lincoln. He enjoys arguing politics with his 92-year-old brother, Ben, and still keeps his hand in the household chores by cutting kindling wood.

He was born in Missouri and crossed the plains with his parents in the famous wagon train of John Gilliam. When 18 he left his Oregon city home to join Olney's cavalry and served two years with the unit patrolling the northwest.

**Oregon Wheat Harvest To be Under 1946 Yield**

(By the Associated Press) Oregon's wheat harvest gets fully under way today with the yield expected to be about 3,500,000 bushels under last year's. The May drought cut sharply into the harvest in some areas, but June rains spared many fields the damage expected. Agriculture officials said the yield probably would be up to long-time averages. hardest, cutting expected yields to 14 or 15 bushels per acre instead of the usual 16 bushels. The county AAA said that fewer than 1000 acres would have grain for harvest. In Wasco county, though, the yield is expected to be about 1,500,000 bushels, only 300,000 under last year. Sherman county expected to get slightly smaller yields also.
