## House of Lords Approves Take-Over of Transport

**LONDON, July 15.**—(AP)—The overwhelmingly conservative House of Lords passed the labor government's inland transport nationalization bill today, but sent it back to the House of Commons with a dozen amendments approved over government protests.

The bill would bring Britain's railroads, bus lines and long distance truckers under government ownership by next January and would involve an estimated \$4,250,000,000 government expenditure to purchase the facilities.

## Yank Legion Commander Freed of Theft Charge

**SEATTLE, July 15.**—(AP)—Roland C. Bartlett, national commander of Yank Legion, was freed yesterday on three charges of petty larceny and embezzlement, and a criminal libel charge against Ken Cristner, former editor of Yank News, was dismissed. Deputy Prosecutor John L. Vogel requested the dismissals because of insufficient evidence.

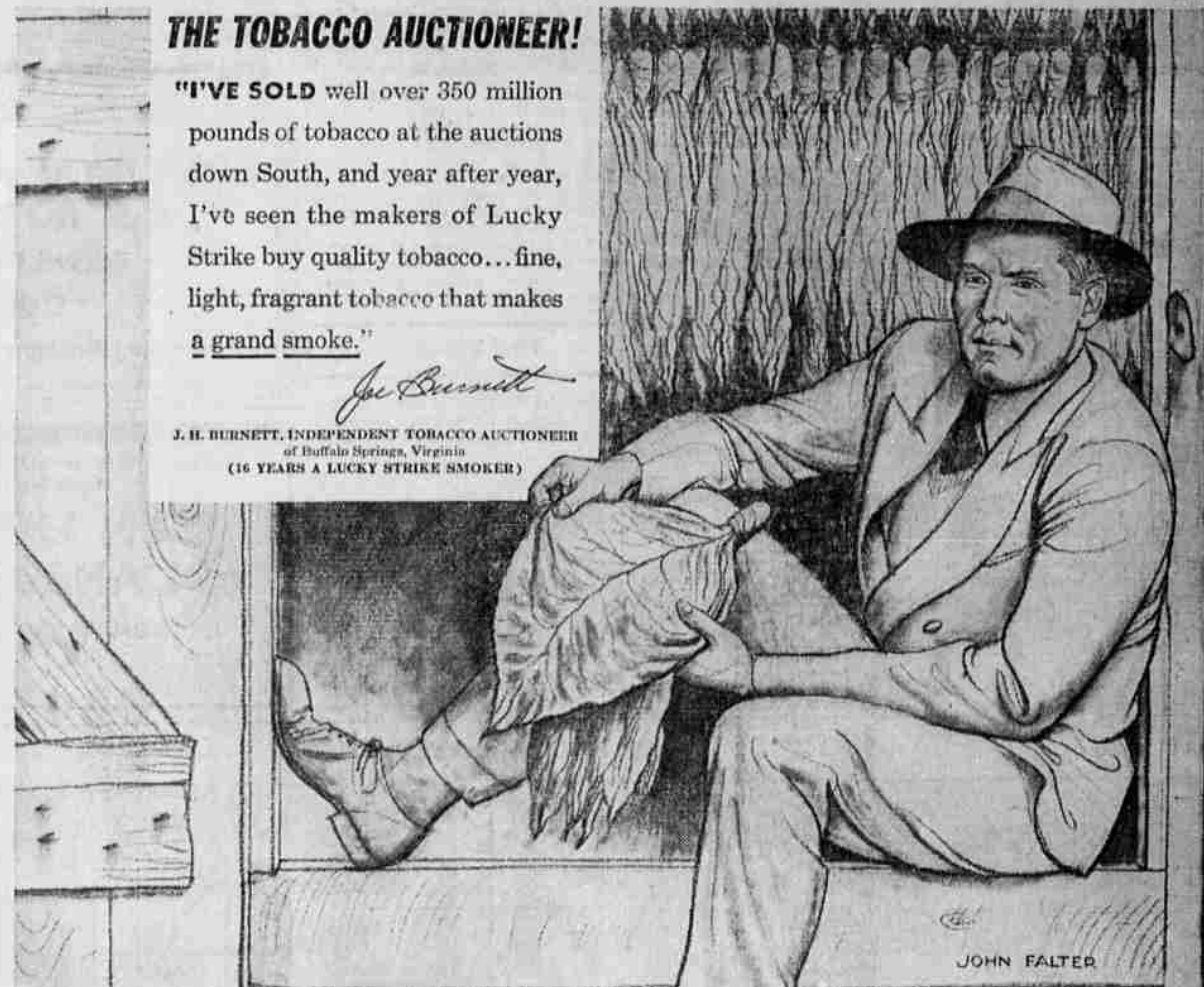
