Double Slayer Pleads Mental Irresponsibility

EVERETT, Wash., July 18. — (AP) — Homer A. Simpson, 33, Vancouver, Wash., mechanic, pleaded not guilty on grounds of mental irresponsibility to both charges of two counts of first degree murder when arraigned before Judge Charles R. Denney in superior court here yesterday. His trial was set for September 2.

Simpson was charged with the murder in Snohomish June 20 of his wife, Anna Rose Simpson, 25, and his father-in-law, Robert N. Cox, 53.

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Race Issue Causes Fistic Battle At AFL Convention

SEATTLE, July 17. — (AP) — A resolution condemning "race discrimination" clause was rejected by the Washington Federation of Labor yesterday following an outbreak of fistfuffs which President E. M. Weston attributed to "left wingers trying to wreck the convention."

The fighting broke out during debate on a resolution that "we condemn all programs of the employers whose purpose in discrimination is to pit one worker against another because of his race, creed or color."

One delegate, an innocent bystander, was given hospital treatment for facial lacerations when caught in the midst of the fracas. Two others also were carried out.

In other convention activity, the federation turned down a resolution urging creation of a third political party in the state, and another urging a poll of federation members regarding their stand on the third party question. It adopted, however, a

resolution by the boxmakers for mobilization of the state's labor forces for "united and effective political action to elect members of organized labor" to office.

Resolutions opposing peacetime military conscription, endorsing a Columbia valley authority, seeking a teachers' tenure measure, and calling for a governor-appointed non-partisan committee on school affairs, were approved.

Another, introduced by the Bremerton Central Labor council, calling for government operation and control of the nation's "wealth, industries and manpower" in wartime was rejected.

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
