

### No War Danger This Generation, Bevin Declares

Ernest Bevin, Britain's ever-daring foreign secretary, took his reputation as a prophet in his hands at the weekend and told a coal miners' picnic in England that there is no danger of another war in this generation so far as he can see.

ject of conflict on the supposedly cheerful occasion of a picnic? Well, because it's a question which never is far from the minds of all thinking people, as you and I well know from the conversations we daily encounter. So Mr. Bevin made his prediction to calm fears, but he was quick to add this important qualification:  
"But in every act you perform, you must keep in mind the children of thirty or forty years from now. Not a day passes, not a moment passes in the job in which I am now engaged without my being fully conscious that a wrong decision, wrong judgment or petulant answer may now condemn a generation."  
"Wise counsel that, for nobody

can afford mistakes in these dangerous days. However, that doesn't mean that we are to refuse to face facts, to apply ourselves energetically to laying plans to meet emergencies, and to put those plans into operation forcefully when the emergencies crop up.  
**U. S. Tops in Strength**  
It would have been interesting if Mr. Bevin had amplified his forecast. Had he done so I dare say it might have developed several "ifs."  
We shall have war if and when some aggressor nation acquires sufficient strength to wage a major conflict and so dares to carry out its aggression in the face of any and all hostile opinion. It strikes me that it might not take a generation for such a hypothetical situation to be created.

day, the date scheduled for adjournment.

Both measures were put aside temporarily Saturday after the Senate passed the four other bills and sent a fifth back to the Banking Committee for further study.

The terminal pay bond measure won approval by a vote of 85 to 0.

It authorizes, but does not require, the cashing after September 1 of an estimated \$1,800,000,000 in special five-year bonds held by an estimated 9,000,000 veterans.

Also sent to the White House Saturday was a measure to increase by 20 per cent pensions to veterans (and their dependents) of the Civil and Spanish American Wars.

**Other Bills Pending**  
Senate passage shunted to the House, meanwhile, bills providing for:

(a) A 15 per cent cost of living increase in subsistence grants to veterans going to school under the GI Bill of Rights. Single veterans payments would be boosted from the current \$85 to \$75 a month; married veterans without children would get \$105 instead of \$90 and those who have children would receive \$120, an increase of \$30.

(b) Renewal and liberalization of the program under which the government provides new automobiles for amputee veterans. The old program, which expired June 30, covered only those who lost a leg. The new one would cover those who have lost the use of one or more legs and arms.
