Western Europe Fears Russia, Coos Man Says

PORTLAND, July 21.—(AP)—Ben Chandler, Coos Bay, State Highway Commissioner, said today that Western Europe is "permeated" with fear of Russia.

Chandler, just back from a trip to Europe to visit his daughter, said the European countries have "fair of frustration" and are badly in need of leadership to start them toward recovery.

He said people of Western European countries "expect us to take care of them. They want aid in the form of loans, but they really know these are gifts."

Loan-Mortgage Bill Has Committee Approval

WASHINGTON, July 22.—(AP)—The Senate Banking Committee yesterday approved a House bill authorizing federal home loan banks to accept mortgages maturing in 25 years as collateral for advances to member institutions.

Another bill approved by the committee would liberalize loans made by Federal Savings and Loan Associations. It too has been passed by the House.
