POLICY ADVANCEMENT

Attending the hearing held in Roseburg Monday to consider creation of six sustained yield forest management master units in Southern Oregon, we were particularly interested in the general public understanding and approval of the federal management policy.

There is, of course, opposition. Opposition is based largely on fear, selfishness or misunderstanding, with a few sincere skeptics. Many persons publicly support the general theory of sustained yield, but challenge technical factors.

Another group of small operators is endeavoring to delay sustained yield by raising rival issues to draw attention away from the chief policy.

There is still another school of thought which would federalize the entire timber resource. All commercial timber, both federally and privately owned, would be placed under governmental control.

Personally, we prefer the sustained yield program which, even with its possibility of monopolistic trend, preserves the traditional American policy of free enterprise and trade competition—a system in which the government is a partner rather than a dictator.

Chambers, Chesnes Of Coast League Headed for Majors

LOS ANGELES, July 23.—(AP)—The Coast has nothing but cheers for chuckers Chambers and Chesnes.

Both, if allowed to finish the year in the Pacific Coast League, appear certain to top the 25-win mark. With the season less than two-thirds gone, Chesnes has won 17, lost six; Chambers, 16 and five.

Chambers' record, not so spectacular because the Angels have more pitching depth than the Seals, shows 14 complete games in 22 appearances, 46 earned runs in 162 innings (about 2.50 per game) and 93 strikeouts.

Both chuckers are good hitters. Chesnes, batting .320, might be the Seals' best if allowed to play everyday, as he would like to. Chambers is in the .300 neighborhood.
