Highway Livestock Ban Reported Violated

Complaints of violations of a recent state law banning livestock on the state highway extending east from Canyonville to the Umpqua National Forest boundary have been received by Sheriff O. T. Carter, he reported today.

The new law, which is an amendment of a 1945 enactment, makes it unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to permit any cattle, horses, mules, sheep, goats, hogs, or other livestock, to run at large, be pastured, staked or tethered upon the highway east of Canyonville. A copy of the law will be posted at the Tiller store so that stock ranchers in the district may study it, Sheriff Carter said.

Drunken Driver Draws Two Fines, Term in Jail

Harold C. Maxwell, Roseburg mill employee, was sentenced to 30 days in the county jail and fined \$100 by Justice of the Peace Hartfield Monday on a charge of driving while under the influence of intoxicating liquor. 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Dry League Seeks Liquor Ads' Curb

SALEM, Ore., July 23.—(AP)—A preliminary initiative measure to restrict liquor, beer and wine advertising will be filed with the State Department in a few days by the Oregon Anti-Liquor League, B. N. Hicks, Oregon City, legislative chairman of the league, said here.

The initiative, which would go on the November, 1948, general election ballot if 18,969 signatures are obtained, would limit the advertising to the name of the producer or dispenser, the name of

the product, the place where it is sold, and the price. So-called "promotion advertising" of alcoholic beverages would be banned.

The measure applies to advertising in newspapers, periodicals and other forms of printing, as well as to radio broadcasting. It applies to all advertising, regardless of whether it originates inside the state.

The Liquor Commission would stop the sale of any product advertised illegally under the act. Maximum penalties are \$1,000 fine and one year in prison.

The advertiser would be penalized, but not the medium carrying the advertisement.

July 1, 1948, will be the dead-

line for obtaining the signatures. The act would become law Feb. 1, 1949, provided the people approve it.
