Farmer Forced by Gulls to Sell Hogs

WALLA WALLA, Wash., July 30.—(AP)—A flock of seagulls, making hogs of themselves, have contributed to driving farmer Carl Nelson temporarily out of the hog-raising business.

The gulls, estimated by Nelson at from 1,000 to 2,500 in number and protected by the law, invaded his hog lot two months ago.

At first Nelson did not object to their presence but shortly they became so bold that they would crowd the hogs away from the feed troughs by sheer force of numbers.

"A sack of shorts would last only about 5 minutes," the hog

feeder said. Various attempts were made to scare the birds away but nothing worked. Nelson resorted to firecrackers thinking the noise might scare the visitors away, but "they seemed to get a degree of entertainment from the flashes."

The latest effort has been to sell the hogs and shut off the water that formerly flowed through the feed lot.

However, some of the birds have persisted in hanging around and Nelson is thinking of appealing to the county commissioners to "abate the nuisance." He is quite convinced that "if the bird lovers want the seagulls to stay around here, someone's going to have to buy my land. I can't afford to feed them."

Britain May Be Forced to Slash Her Armed Units

LONDON, July 30.—(AP)—Authoritative sources said today Great Britain might reduce her armed forces and dip into her £440,000,000 (\$2,560,000,000) gold and dollar reserve as emergency measures to meet the prospective winter economic crisis.

Left wing Labor Party members have been urging the government to cut down the Army, Navy and Air Force, which had 1,297,300 men at the start of the month.

Field Marshal Montgomery, chief of the British imperial general staff, was to cut short his Far Eastern tour and fly home within a few days to advise the Labor government concerning reduction of the armed forces, these informants said.

Whitehall sources said tapping the gold and dollar reserve would be a stopgap between the time when the \$3,750,000,000 loan from the United States is exhausted late this year or early next and the time when the projected Marshall plan or some other U. S. program of financial aid to Europe became effective. (Congress, adjourned until January, would have to approve and appropriate any additional billions for Europe.)

A wave of selling dropped home British securities as much as \$4 Monday on the London Stock Exchange. The Financial Times attributed the bearishness to "disquiet over the economic situation with possible political repercussions."

The possibility that Prime Minister Attlee's government might call a new general election was considered seriously in financial and political circles. The Labor Party's Daily Herald said talk of a possible coalition government was "fantastic."
