Correspondence Courses Available to Veterans

A compiled list of the correspondence courses available to veterans for 1947-48 is now ready for distribution, according to Miss Mozelle Hair, head of correspondence study for the general extension division of the State System of Higher Education.

Courses are made up for a contract by the state system with the Veterans Administration under Public Law 246, course for veterans already in school or studying at home, and Public Law 16, courses for disabled veterans. The contract permits veterans to obtain correspondence study under the G. I. Bill.

Research shows that 201 men were enrolled in correspondence studies under Public Law 346, and 111 men under Public Law 16 last year, according to Miss Hair. Information on correspondence study may be secured by writing to Oregon State Extension Division, University of Oregon, Eugene.
