15 Strikers Killed in Battle With Soldiers

PARIS, Aug. 5. (AP)—The French press agency said today 15 strikers were killed and about 40 were wounded yesterday near Sfax, Tunisia, in a riot which followed an attack on an Army motorized column.

All laborers in Tunisia, a French North African protectorate, were called out in a general strike yesterday. Troops were sent to take over the Tunisian railway line between Sfax and Gafsa.

The French press agency said the troops were fired upon by strikers as they approached the railway yards of Sfax, and six soldiers were wounded.

Anchorage Hit by Utilities Strike

ANCHORAGE, Alaska, Aug. 5. (AP)—With negotiations deadlocked Anchorage city councilmen and striking municipal workers today awaited the arrival of Leonard E. Evans, Juneau labor conciliator, invited here to help mediate the walkout, now in its fifth day.

Although Evans' services were asked by the council, Lou Taylor, business agent of the AFL International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, said the union favored the intervention of a conciliator.

A stalemate over wage demands caused 140 electrical workers and 16 telephone operators to leave their jobs at midnight last Thursday. The electrical workers had demanded wage increases of 17 to 19 per cent. The city countered with an offer of a five per cent raise for the electricians and 20 cents an hour more for the operators.

With only four girls on the telephone switchboard to handle emergency calls, Mayor Francis C. Bowden said he would personally run the board if the four are withdrawn.
