**Take Home Pay Slashed by Taxes, Costs of Living**

WASHINGTON, Aug. 5.—(AP)—The Bureau of Labor Statistics today showed that although factory workers earned an average of \$48.46 a week in May, a man with no dependents earning this amount would take home only \$41.52 after tax deductions.

Further the BLS said, this \$41.52 was only \$26.49 in terms of 1939 dollars, because of price increases since 1939.

The bureau's regular announcement of hours and earnings included for the first time a table which (1) gave the earnings after deduction of income and social security taxes, and (2) translated this figure into 1939 dollars.

According to the table a worker earning \$48.66 with a wife and two children, had \$47 left after tax deductions, and this would be \$29.99 in 1939 dollars.

In today's tables, the average hourly earnings of factory workers were given as \$1.208 for May, compared with \$1.186 in April.

These figures included overtime hours. The straight-time average for May, including overtime work, was given as \$1.17, or 20 cents more than the straight time average for January, 1945.

**Krug Puzzled by Stockman, Voices Praise for Cordon**  
PORTLAND, Aug. 5.—(AP)—Lack of understanding of the West's needs and failure of western congressmen to support projects in their own districts were blamed by Secretary of the Interior J. A. Krug here for the clashing of Interior agency budgets by the 80th Congress.

He said supplemental appropriations would be asked for Bonneville Power Administration and other projects when Congress reconvenes in January, but said meanwhile BPA must operate under difficult circumstances.

Referring to the vote by 35 western congressmen not to support Interior budget requests, Krug said he was puzzled by op-

position of Congressman Stockman (R-Ore.) to Bonneville. "I haven't been able to understand his position."

"It is no longer a question of public vs. private power. We've got to have power and everyone looks to Bonneville to supply it. When you don't get complete support from congressmen and senators in your own area, you are vulnerable to so-called economy cuts," Krug asserted.

The cabinet officer praised Senator Cordon (R-Ore.) for what he said was a "terrific battle" by Cordon for larger Bonneville appropriations.

**Actor Cornell Wilde, Beautiful Wife Part**

HOLLYWOOD, Aug. 5.—(AP)—A celebrated Hollywood romance has ended with the announcement that handsome Cornell Wilde and his wife, beautiful Pat Knight, have separated.

"I have had too many pictures during the last two and a half years," said Wilde. "I have been exhausted and nervous. Pat has had her problems. \* \* \* At this time we have no further plans."

Wilde and his actress wife were married Sept. 21, 1937. They have a four-year-old daughter, Wendy.
