In order to stimulate production, he continued:

"This will involve some sacrifice of individual liberty, though as little as possible. It may be necessary to take steps to limit employment on less essential work."

Attlee rejected suggestions in conservative newspapers that he invite the conservatives to join in a coalition government, thus abandoning his socialist program. He said:

"No question of coalition arises. . . I say to one and all 'This is your fight.'"

Attlee continued: "I am appealing to all the people of this country to cooperate wholeheartedly with the government, just as they did in the war. To win through requires the same qualities as those displayed during those years."

Spending Cuts Planned
Opposition members interjected: "And the same leadership."

The interruption, harking back to the wartime leadership of conservative Winston Churchill, produced an uproar of cheers and counter-cheers.

To save dollars, Attlee said Britain would take these steps: Permit movie makers showing films here to convert only a fourth of their earnings into non-British currency. Permit Britons

overseas to spend only \$140 on foreign vacations in the 14-month period beginning Oct. 1, instead of \$300 in the yearly period as at present. Cut by one-third the basic gasoline ration of 11 gallons a month for private motorists with 10-horsepower cars.

1. The two Hungarian banks scheduled to get the American funds are under what Marshall called the threat of nationalization.

2. The cotton situation has changed for the better since April 30 when the bank and a Hungarian government reached a tentative agreement regarding the credit.

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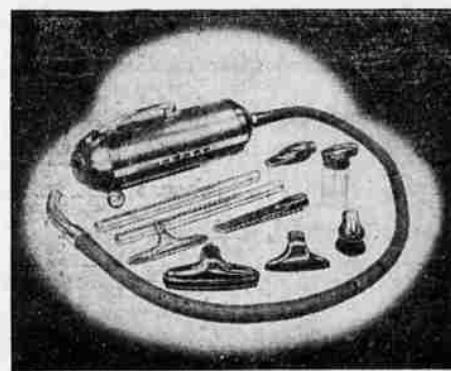
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
