The engine, which develops 150 pounds of thrust, is 29 inches long with a maximum diameter of 22 inches. A 7 1/2-inch turbine wheel, driven by rapidly expanding exhaust gases, produces the power. Work Halt to Protest Arrests Decried by Jews

JERUSALEM, Aug. 7.—(AP)—Jewish leaders decried a complete three-hour work stoppage this afternoon in protest against the internment by British authorities of three Jewish mayors and some 40 other Jews for the avowed purpose of checking terrorism. Violence continued meanwhile. British authorities announced that 12 oil tank cars were wrecked by a mine explosion at Ras El Ain, between Tel Aviv and Haifa. The blast ripped up 300 yards of railway track, but caused no casualties, the announcement said.

Russia May be Left Out Of Japanese Peace Pact

WASHINGTON, Aug. 7.—(AP)—The United States probably will suggest to other interested nations that the initial 11-nation conference on a Japanese peace treaty be held in early September, immediately preceding the opening of the United Nations general assembly in New York.

All of this planning is in line with a reported decision to go ahead without Russian participation. If the Russians persist in holding aloof from the American proposals for making 11 nations instead of only the big four powers responsible for drafting the Japanese treaty.
