

Slator Miller Has Post With Sugar Planters Assn.

Slator M. Miller, a former resident of Roseburg, now in Honolulu, has been named secretary of the Hawaiian Sugar Planters Association. He has been continuously associated with the Hawaiian sugar industry since 1928. He leaves the position of industrial relations director to take his new post.

A graduate of Roseburg High School and U. S. Military Academy, West Point, he abandoned an Army career to join the sugar planters' association as secretary of the Bureau of Labor and Statistics. He was transferred to the Manila office in 1930 and three years later returned to the Hawaiian headquarters to join the staff of the experiment station.

He became associated with the Kaimuki Sugar Co. in 1934, and in 1938 went to the Ewa Plantation Co. as general field superintendent. He rejoined the HSPA staff in 1944 as director of industrial relations. His first major assignment was the importation of 6,000 Filipino workers and their families for the sugar and pineapple plantations. This took him back to the Philippines, where he remained from September, 1945, until July, 1946.

He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Marcellus M. Miller, both deceased, who resided in Roseburg for many years. His father was auditor for the Roseburg Review and for the News-Review, following consolidation of the two papers, until the time of his death.

Rapist, Thief Fails In Break Try After Hearing Sentence

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 7.—(AP)—Frank S. Avilez, 26, known as the "Black Gloved Rapist," made a wild attempt to escape from a courtroom yesterday after being sentenced to 440 years in prison on rape, robbery and burglary charges.

Six policemen finally were able to control the tall, rangy prisoner. Avilez had stood for two hours before Superior Judge Melvin Cronin while being sentenced individually on seven counts of rape, four attempted rapes, one assault, 10 burglaries and 10 robberies. All this time he stood quietly, handcuffed to Bailiff Frank Kneiss. "How a man could conduct himself like that is beyond me," Judge Cronin concluded. "I think that is all."

Bailiff Burns turned to take his prisoner to the jail, a cameraman's flash bulb flared. Avilez pulled the deputy around, kicked at the photographer, and then lunged at two deputies.

Six officers finally got Avilez down and were able to hold him. A lamp was knocked over and crashed to the floor. Avilez' mother, his wife and two sisters screamed at him to be quiet.

Still fighting like a tiger, he was controlled only after his hands had been cuffed behind his back and leg irons were applied. Then he was carried up to the jail.

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Direct High Court Rulings on Laws Urged by Norblad

WASHINGTON, Aug. 7.—(AP)—Rep. Norblad (R-Ore.) said yesterday he will propose legislation in the next Congress to permit the Supreme Court to rule directly on the constitutionality of important laws such as the Taft-Hartley act.

At present, the court rules on constitutional questions only on appeal of a case involving the disputed law from lower federal courts.

"This process," Norblad said, "often results in a delay of a year or two before we know whether an important law is constitutional."

"A good example is the Taft-Hartley labor bill which has already been questioned in the lower courts. . . . We may not learn its legality for many months."

"It would certainly be in the best interest of labor, management, and particularly of the public, if (constitutionality of) this act could be determined without a long-delaying process of hearings and appeals in the lower courts."

"I recall that the National Recovery act, which vitally affected the country, was determined unconstitutional after we had been governed by this law for almost two years."

An amendment to the constitution is required to make the suggested change in Supreme Court procedures.

Norblad said he realized it would be "improper" for the

Supreme Court to be burdened with a mass of litigation on minor matters, and that, therefore, his bill will provide that the Supreme Court act only if requested by a two-thirds vote of both Houses of Congress.

Body of Drowned Man Taken to Corvallis

The body of Arnold Robert Johnson, 46, who was drowned when he jumped into the South Umpqua River from the Oak Street Bridge last Sunday, has been taken to Corvallis by the Long & Orr Mortuary. Funeral services and interment will be in that city. Mr. Johnson came to Roseburg from Corvallis about a week ago. He leaves his father, Mr. J. J. Johnson, and a sister, Mrs. Elmer Hathaway, both of Corvallis.
