FRIENDLY CIRCLE CLUB TO MEET

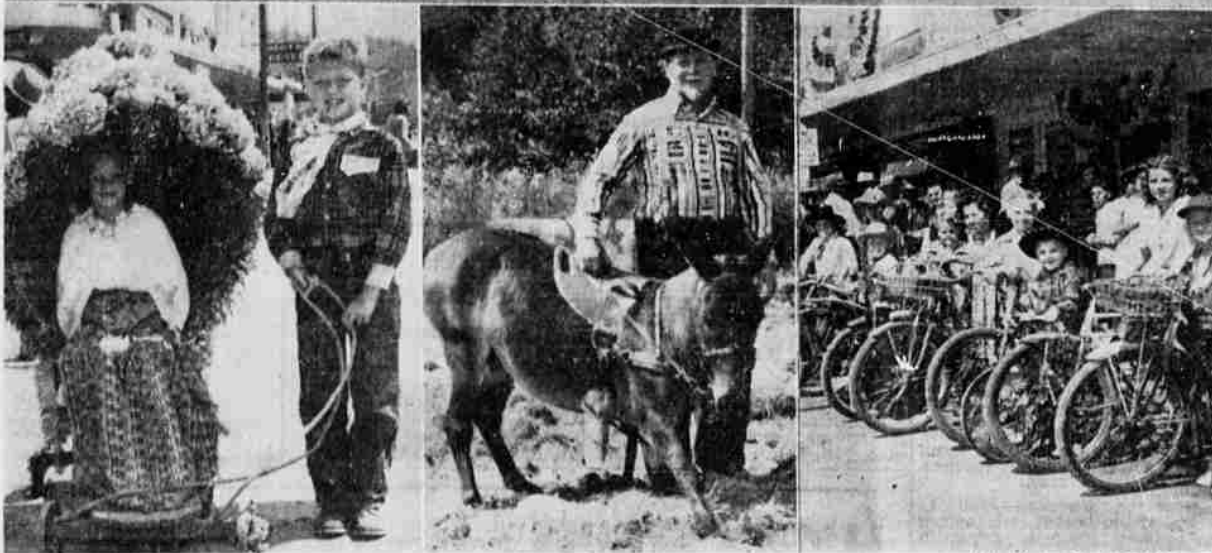
