NATIONAL CONFERENCE OF AMERICAN WEAVERS TO BE HELD IN SALEM

Plans for the national conference of American Weavers, August 19-29, are being completed by members of the Salem Weavers Guild. Mrs. Louis Anderson is president and in charge of arrangements.

Literature sent on the conference reveals that the conference under the direction of Creative Crafts School of Weaving, Guernsey, Pa., headed by Mrs. Osma Gallinger, director. The exhibit of weaving by Mrs. Gallinger and her staff; by Oregon State College, Joan Patterson, Ceramics Studio and Art and Crafts Society of Portland, will be open to the public from two to nine Sunday, August 24, at Lausanne hall, Willamette University.

This is the first conference to be held in the far west and according to Mrs. Gallinger, the registration is much higher than anticipated.

There will be a variety of classes for beginners and advanced weavers. Besides Mrs. Gallinger the staff includes: Mrs. Donnell B. Young, teacher of science, arts and crafts at Holton-Arms School, Washington, D. C. She has studied weaving at Berea College, Ky., and Penland School of Handcrafts. She has made a special study of Mexican and Canadian weaving.

Mrs. Clara McNulty, a nationally known craftsworker and weaving researcher, who conducts classes at the art museum at San Antonio, Tex., will be present as will Mrs. Lorraine P. Kosmich of Milwaukee, who has had a long career of study and is known for her active work in the field of modern textile design.

Lausanne hall has been acquired for the conference classes and for the boarding and rooming of those attending from out of town. The conference is not limited to weavers and anyone interested in the courses or attending the many exhibits arranged for the conference sessions are asked to write to Willamette University.
