At the top of the stretch stanza Springfield drew the curtain and all Squirts threats of a comeback went in vain as they were out of two Roseburg errors and a two-sacker. They gained two more in the ninth off Hamer's Texas leaguer and another Squirts misplay.

Springfield's Frank Hiltz, curve baller and speedballer, outperformed Squirts' Yang and Graham in getting nine strikeouts, issuing seven hits and four base-on-balls. The Roseburg duo allowed 13 hits, three walks, and whiffed 10 between them.
