They moved to within seven games off the pace by coming from behind to nip the Pittsburgh Pirates, 7-5. Bob Elliott, former Pirate, turned defeat into victory with a three-run homer with two out in the ninth off Lyons, third Pirate pitcher.

The Giants bowed 8-1 to the Cincinnati Reds. It was the New Yorkers' eighth straight loss.

The Chicago Cubs dropped both ends of a twin bill to the Philadelphia Phillies, 8-1 and 8-2. Heintzelman and Rowe stopped the Cubs in the first.

The American League's front-running New York Yankees opened their final tour of the west dropping a 2-1 decision to the Tigers in Detroit.
