Wallace Frowns on Progressive Trend

NEW YORK, Aug. 28.—(AP)—President Truman's administration "has not earned the support of progressives," Henry A. Wallace says in a Labor Day editorial in the current issue of the New Republic magazine, of which he is the editor.

The former vice-president asserted that on this Labor Day "we should not be discussing which is the lesser of evils," the Truman administration or the Republican party, but "we should be planning to avoid the necessity of such a choice by winning control of the Democratic convention."

He said that "some progressives, through an astounding naïveté and lack of political judgment, are dissipating their power with premature pledges" to the Truman administration, and added:

"No liberal can safely pledge support to this administration at a time when our foreign policy includes the support of reactionaries everywhere; when the administration is advocating ever greater armaments, demanding universal military training and promoting war-mindfulness; when it is using gentle exhortation rather than political power to get price reductions; and makes only feeble gestures to win liberal and labor support."

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U. S. Jury Accuses Realty Boards of Commission 'Fix'

WASHINGTON, Aug. 28.—(AP)—Attorney General Clark announced yesterday a federal grand jury has indicted the National Association of Real Estate Boards and the Washington Real Estate Board on charges of anti-trust violations.

The indictment alleges the National Association and the Real Estate Board in the District of Columbia have engaged in a criminal conspiracy to restrain trade in the housing field in the district by fixing the commission rates to be charged by real estate dealers in property transfers.

Clark also announced the government is filing a civil anti-trust suit against the same defendants, and against Herbert U. Nelson, executive vice president of the National Association, and 15 members of the Washington Real Estate board.

The civil suit asks cancellation of "unlawful provisions of the constitution, by-laws, rules and regulations of the National Association and of the Washington board, which fix uniform commission rates."

Two federal grand juries are currently sitting in Washington to inquire into possible anti-trust violations in the housing field and in the distribution and sale of gasoline in the District of Columbia.

The two panels were convened shortly after Clark announced that he was directing the Justice Department's anti-trust division to press investigations into any indicated "conspiracies" to maintain or increase the current price levels of living cost items.

Car Assigned for Driver Course at High School

Roseburg High School's dual control driver training car has been assigned and is en route for delivery to the school, Oregon State Motor Association officials announced today.

Roseburg is one of the first schools in the nation to receive one of the new Chevrolet cars for driver training purposes, the motor association announced. The car is being loaned to the school by the Hansen Chevrolet Company, through an agreement worked out between the AAA and the Chevrolet Motor Division of General Motors.

Driver training instruction at the high school will be under the direction of Homer W. Grow, who attended the teacher training course held in Portland recently. Attendance at this course enabled the school to become eligible to receive one of the new dual control cars, according to Paul S. Elliott, superintendent of schools.

Albert E. Rutter Claimed by Death

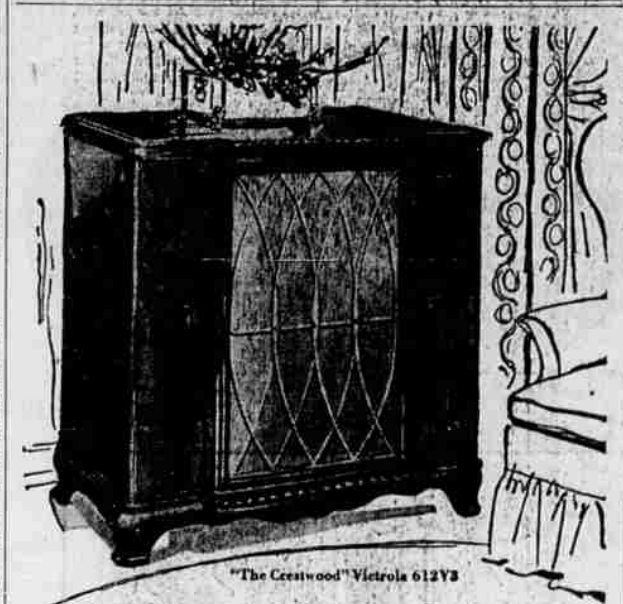
