

More Money For Science Research Urged by Truman

WASHINGTON, Aug. 28.—(AP)—An eight-point program for expanding scientific research to promote the nation's security and prosperity—capped by a proposal for doubling expenditures on science by 1957—was recommended today by President Truman's scientific research board.

And Mr. Truman, in a statement accompanying issuance of the report, said:

"We must constantly enlarge the boundaries of scientific knowledge in order to continue to provide the benefits of full production and full employment, and in order to protect our democracy from the dangers it faces in an uneasy world."

The report placed heavy emphasis on the need for basic research, and President Truman commented:

"The fact that only a thin trickle of scientific knowledge is today reaching from other countries constitutes an emergency and a challenge."

"To meet this challenge, we must promote the rapid growth of basic research, the cross fertilization of ideas among our scientists, and the maturing of a new generation of scientists who will think boldly and daringly."

World unrest stressed declaring that at present the United States has "no unified or

comprehensive policy on scientific research or the support of science," and that extension of scientific knowledge "may reasonably be said to be a major factor in national survival," the board's report declared.

"In the present state of the world, this situation can not be allowed to continue. The public interest is too intimately associated with scientific progress for science to be treated as a governmental stepchild."

The board, headed by John R. Steelman, urged that "by 1957 we should be devoting at least one per cent of our income to research and development in the universities, industry and the government."

(At present, public and private spending on research amounts to \$1,100,000,000 a year—or about a half of one per cent of the national income.)
