

Brian Donlevy's Decree of Divorce Custody by Court

LOS ANGELES, Sept. 30.—(AP)—Former Singer Marjorie Lane was the winner over husband Brian Donlevy in the second round of their marital battle, with round three scheduled to come up today.

Mrs. Donlevy yesterday won her motion to set aside the actor's divorce when Superior Judge Allen W. Ashburn ruled she had been forced by "undue influence, coercion, duress and fraud" to consent to the decree.

Donlevy had won the opening round when he obtained the interlocutory decree last Feb. 11.

Her attorney, Isaac Pacht, indicated he would open the next chapter by filing an answer and cross-complaint to Donlevy's suit today.

The actor's wife—who, like Donlevy, was not present in court—took yesterday's decision after a torrid two hours of legal argument, 70 minutes by Pacht and 50 by S. S. Hahn, Donlevy's counsel.

It concluded, temporarily at least, the sensational battle of affidavits in which Donlevy charged his wife with "adulterous rendezvous" and she countercharged that she was "entrapped" and had been encouraged by him to go out with other men.

Judge Ashburn sided with Attorney Pacht that Donlevy had held their four-year-old daughter, Judith, as a "hostage" to compel her to consent to his terms.

The court ruled that it was coercion the way Donlevy "held the whip hand—and used it" after he discovered his wife in bed

with James Hannan last Dec. 15 in a New York hotel room.

"When she returned to her husband," the judge commented, "she could get no sympathy from him—and rightfully so."

Northwest Symphony Sets Washington Concert Plans

SEATTLE, Oct. 1.—(AP)—The combined symphony orchestras of Seattle and Tacoma will be known as the Pacific Northwest Symphony, G. Baltzer Peterson, president of the Seattle Symphony Orchestra, and Mrs. Everett Griggs, 2d, president of the Tacoma Philharmonic, announced jointly today. The Olympic fine arts guild will also join in the new organization. Eugene Linden, conductor of the Tacoma orchestra, will direct two of the eight concerts here, and Carl Bricken, Seattle conductor, two of the four Tacoma performances. One concert will be held at Olympia.

Russian Objections Beaten By U. N. Vote

NEW YORK, Oct. 1.—(AP)—The United Nations assembly Monday overrode Russian objections and decided to postpone further efforts to settle the deadlock between India and the Soviet Ukraine over a seat on the security council.

After seven unsuccessful ballots, the assembly voted 29 to 13 to drop the question temporarily. The assembly adjourned until 8 A.M. PST tomorrow when it will take up the election of six replacement members of the economic and social council.

The seventh ballot was the Ukraine 33 India 23.

The five big powers, led by Russia's Andrei Y. Vishinsky, had beaten down two earlier attempts to stop balloting before a motion by Belgian Premier Paul-Henri Spaak finally was approved.

At one point Vishinsky charged that countries opposing the election of the Ukraine to the security council were either forgetting "or wish to violate the charter" of the United Nations.

One Killed, Two Hurt, in Car-Truck Collision

ELLENBURG, Oct. 1.—(AP)—Wilson Whited, 55, of Baker, Ore., was killed and his brother, Tom Whited of Ellensburg, and Raymond A. Reno were critically hurt in a double accident near Grandview, the Record learned from the state patrol and the hospital at Sunnyside.

Tom Whited, 45, manager of the Lazy F dude ranch, suffered a rib fracture and punctured lung and Reno received a skull fracture, the hospital said.

The Record said a truck driven by Wilson Whited and a car driven by Robert D. Henry of Grandview went into the ditch when Reno's car approached as the two were passing. There were no injuries, but the truck protruded onto the highway and another car struck it, overturning the truck on the Whited brothers. Reno was hit either by the truck or the oncoming car.
