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Newsboys Are Highly Praised

WASHINGTON, Oct. 6.—(AP)—The nation's newspaper boys got a salute today on newspaperboy day from several prominent Americans who started out as paper carriers themselves.

They included Associate Justice William O. Douglas, Governors Thomas E. Dewey of New York, Earl Warren of California and Mon C. Wallgren of Washington. Senators Wagner (D-N.Y.), Morse (R-Ore.) and Lucas (D-Ill.), Baseball Commissioner A. B. Chandler, and Charles Luckman, head of the Citizens Food Committee.

They joined the American Newspaper Publishers Association, the International Circulation Managers Association and the Treasury Department in honoring the carriers through the advertising columns of several hundred newspapers.

The Treasury's National Newspaper Boys Committee, headed by Howard W. Stodhill, business manager of the Philadelphia Evening Bulletin, numbers more than 50,000 newspaper boys as members of thrift clubs.

Comments by the ex-carriers, included:

Governor Warren: "Many thousands of successful Americans will testify to the value of this training in shaping one's career."

Governor Wallgren: "It is in line with the enterprise and diligence which is shown by paper

carriers in their work that they should also take this interest in the bond campaigns."

Senator Morse: "Most of the newspaper boys whom I know, and they are a sturdy, fine, self-reliance group, are either supplementing the family income or they are saving their money toward a college education."
