**Prison Sentence Follows Assault on Policeman**  
PENDLETON, Ore., Oct. 7.—(AP)—Donald Duane Hyman, 23, charged with assault with intent to kill Freewater Police Chief George Hays Aug. 18, pleaded guilty to a lesser charge of assault with a dangerous weapon and was sentenced to five years in the state prison.

**Hyman, a Freewater area fruit harvest worker, changed his plea in circuit court where he was scheduled to go on trial Thursday. He was sentenced by Circuit Judge Homer I. Watts.**

**James McGehee, 25, also of Freewater, previously was given six months in the Umatilla county jail after he pleaded guilty to assault and battery in connection with the same case.**

**He and Hyman originally were charged with kidnapping Hays and two other Freewater residents but the county grand jury reduced the charges.**

**QUAKE REPORTED**  
ATHENS, Oct. 7.—(AP) Press dispatches from Kalamata in the Southern Peloponnese reported today that a brief earth tremor which shook the area last night had caused a number of casualties and some damage. Kalamata was temporarily without electricity as a result of damage to the local power station, the dispatches said.
