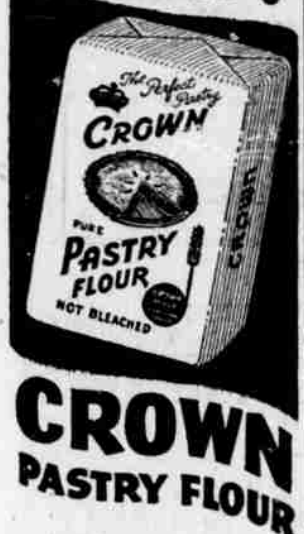
Auxiliary to Meet—The Eagles Auxiliary will meet Monday night at 7:30 o'clock at the Eagles hall.
